Rapist sought

A 30-year-old Sanibel woman added to Sunday's police search for the assailant.

The incident marks the first forcible rape reported on the island in six years.

In the darkness, helicopters droned overhead most of the night.
 But halfway into the mission a shrapnel or windstorm which typically lasts 18 to 48 hours hit with winds Kitchen estimated at 50 to 75 mph.
 Rain turned the dry into red Georgia mud and the team's communications equipment would not work.
 They sat facing each other leaning against 100 pound rucksacks draped with ponchos in a makeshift shelter.
 Three quarters of the helicopters completed the mission while the rest were grounded.
 Kitchen and his partner sat for two days. But with their food gone and water running low, Kitchen left his partner where they were dropped, took his weapon and embarked on a search for friendly forces.
 Guided by his compass and after pacing many kilometers, Kitchen came upon a supply road which he determined was the Montarran military supply route, bulldozed roads which were named for states.
 Kitchen knew it was a north-south route and returned to get his partner. The men realized by walking south they would eventually cross the Saudi-Iraq border.
 Shortly after reaching the road, the two were picked up by a truck full of French soldiers and were later flown up the Euphrates River and reunited with the 101st.
 An hour after they rejoined the 101st the ground war was over.

 Additionally, a break-in at a West Gulf Drive home in early April might have also been committed by the same man, Hinze said.

There was no sexual attack and the woman was unharmed while the perpetrator and an accomplice ransacked her house, police said.

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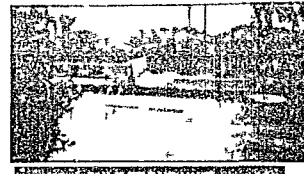

Search for drugs begins at area high schools

The School District of Lee County will implement the first phase of its drug sniffing dog education and awareness program this month at the district's seven public high schools.

The school board approved the pilot drug dog program in March and schools will be searched in alphabetical order with Cypress Lake High School, which serves island students second on the list.

Phase one a search of hallways lockers and common areas conducted after school hours should be completed by June 12 the end of the school year according to Jim Browder, director of secondary operations.

Initially, each school will be searched just once affecting some 11,000 high school students county wide.

Officers and dogs from the Lee County Port Authority will conduct the searches at no charge to the school district.

Each school principal will accompany the search officer and dog along with several other people of the principal's choosing.

Principals can elect to be accompanied by teachers or parents but the number will be limited to two or three to reduce distractions, Browder noted.

Each search should take between one to two hours, he added.

Substances discovered in a student's locker will be given to the school resource officer for disposal. Student's having access to a locker which is found to contain drugs will be called to the principal's office for a conference.

Phases two and three of the program will call for searches of school parking lots, hall ways and lockers while students are in class are scheduled to begin during the 1992-1993 school year.

Guidelines for the drug dog program approved by the school board prohibit members of the news media from covering the actual school searches. Results of the search program will be released collectively by Superintendent James Adams or the district's public information office.

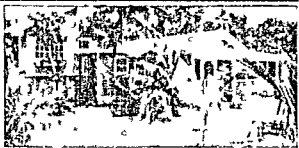

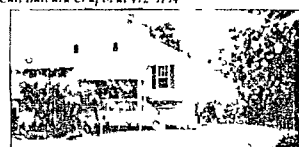

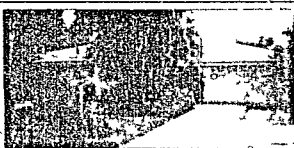

Preserving history puts property owners in limbo

The Sanibel Community House moved one step closer to being placed on Sanibel's Register of Historic Landmarks despite the fact that the requirements, rules and regulations imposed by being named to the list have yet to be drafted.

Sanibel planning commissioners unanimously recommended to the Sanibel City Council that the house be placed on the list.

The city council has the final word on the matter and this Tuesday will consider the nominations of the community house (the Sanibel Community Church, the Shore Haven House, the Ruffland Graves, the Beach House, the Briley Store and Miss Charlotta's Tea House).

Several of the owners were opposed to the nomination not only because they do not know what it entails but because it brings all development to a halt during the historic nomination process.

The owner of the Shore Haven house is in the midst of plans to add a room and the community church is about to begin the final phase of its three-tiered development plan. If the property is nominated, an additional permit certificate of appropriateness is required for development.

Members of the Sanibel Community Association extensively studied the matter and asked for a moratorium on historic nominations until standards are drafted. They also asked commissioners to continue the matter and asked the city's Historical Preservation Committee to withdraw the nomination of their church.

But planning commissioners said they had no authority to call a moratorium and instead of prolonging the issue will continue to vote to pass their recommendation to the council which can call for a moratorium if its members see fit.

Eileen Steele representing the historical committee admitted the whole attitude of the Historical Preservation Committee has been obviously very simplistic and she said members realize they have a lot to learn.

However she did not offer to withdraw the nomination because the group is "madly trying to grasp historical landmarks which she said are quickly disappearing."

She told community association members that her group did not care what is done to the

inside of a structure but association president R. J. Cummings said he only has verbal assurances to that fact, nothing is in writing.

Commissioner Louise Johnson noted that boundaries while loosely defined in the land development code are still unclear. Interior work would probably also require a certificate of appropriateness, she said.

As you know we have been struggling with the problem of trying to get a clear definition of exactly what the rules and regulations are which define what an organization can or cannot do once its property is on the historic register. These rules and regulations do not exist in writing at this time, Cummings said.

The community association's board interviewed a number of preservation's experienced in historic preservation and studied several other governments' preservation and zoning documents.

In addition to the lack of regulations, Cummings said he was also concerned by the fact that the nomination resolution identifies not only the community house but all the land owned by the association including the out buildings and the Pirate Playhouse across the street.

The same is true for the nomination of the Ruffland Graves which is identified by the tax strap number that includes a good portion of Periwinkle Trailer Park.

But commission attorney Beverly Grady said the strap numbers are commonly used to help the public identify the property and only the building or site specifically named would be nominated.

Use of all a property's tax strap numbers is common procedure used in every case, Grady noted.

Additionally Cummings said it is not clearly identified as to why the house is nominated.

Criteria include historical, geographical, architectural or archaeological importance.

Johnson said when the planning commission resolution is approved the specific qualifying criteria is always named.

Cummings said based on our extensive research over the past three weeks we would like to be so bold as to make some recommendations for improving the historical preservation process as follows and this is meant to be constructive:

1. That consideration be given to strengthening the preservation committee by adding three professionals, one architect (Cummings said he knows of three), one qualified historian (the committee already has one) and one local real estate agent.

Currently there are no professional requirements to be a member of the committee. Members are appointed by the city council.

2. That the city prepare and publish rules and regulations regarding repairs and maintenance of historic structures both inside and out.

3. That owners of designated or nominated structures be notified of the specific criteria by which they qualify.

4. And finally that consideration be given to the question of owner consent.

Additionally Cummings asks that nominated owners be contacted by members of the Historical Preservation Committee who could explain the process and help alleviate concerns.

Thus far no committee member contacted any nominated owner.

The commission could take no action on any of these matters, Grady pointed out because all they were authorized to do was rule whether the site was historic.

Some commissioners were not adverse to continuing the hearing for two weeks but others said since the circumstances would not change nor be disputed the fact the site was historic there was no reason to continue.

Moreover other sites were originally scheduled to be nominated but were not on the final list.

In a memo dated March 23 by planner Jerri Lasky she stated these properties were also being nominated: White Heron, the Aulbert Post Office Site, the Mitchell House, the J. N. Ding Darling Cable Hut and Morning Clories.

The memo further stated all the cases must have been heard April 28.

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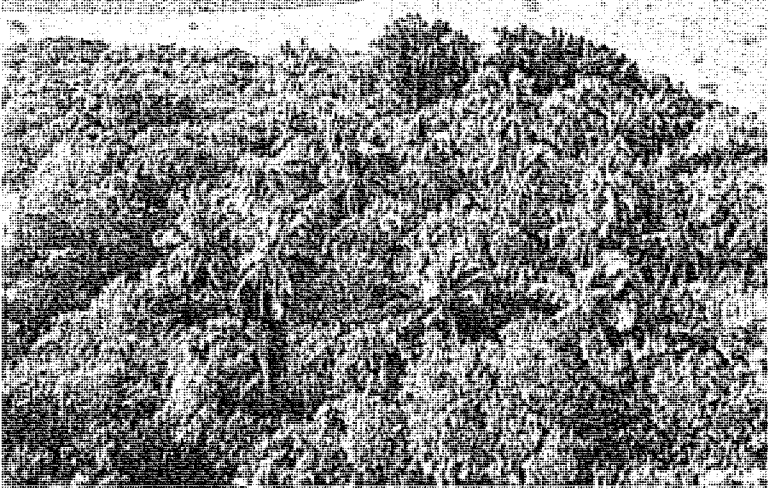
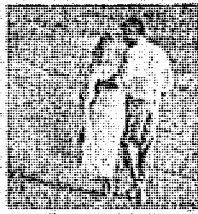
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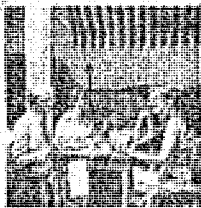


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Foundation named finalist, misses Governor's Award

The Sanibel Captiva Conservation Foundation was named a finalist in the first annual Governor's Environmental Education Award competition, missing the high award as one of six finalists.

Erick Lindblad, executive director of the foundation, and Kristie Seaman, education director, joined Florida Governor Lawton Chiles and the five other finalists at a special recognition dinner in Tallahassee.

Seaman said the award in its first year was organized by businesses around the state interested in publicizing why the environment is important to Florida's economy.

Initially five finalists were to be chosen from the 110 nominations, but the committee appointed to make the selection could not eliminate any of the six which made it to the final decision-making process.

Other finalists include the Florida Federation of Garden Clubs, Monroe County Environmental Education Task Force, Pine Jog Nature Center, Martine Research Council and Save the Manatee/Florida Audubon Society.

Seaman wrote the award proposal which includes the foundation's involvement with



Erosion board nixes new consulting expense

The Captiva Erosion Prevention District refused to authorize funds for more engineering consulting work to manage erosion at Blind Pass.

Tom Campbell with Coastal Planning and Engineering met with erosion officials during an emergency meeting this month asking for funds to meet with engineers from the city of Sanibel and the state Department of Natural Resources in full disclosure.

Campbell is engineer for both the erosion district and the Blind Pass Inter-Management Plan and local committee.

Stephen Cutler, erosion district chairman, said Lonnie Ryder, the Blind Pass committee representative for the natural resource department, has indicated the state does not have the money to pay 75 percent of extra costs associated with the inter-management plan.

"The best he could offer was reimbursement to (the erosion district) which would have to bear the brunt of any additional cost of the plan," Cutler said.

"I've always been irritated by Fom's nickel and dimeing in terms of the half a million dollars work we gave him last year. He's been late for every single step of the plan. The committee has not gotten information ahead of time. In the final analysis, his abil-

ity to meet with engineers with the state and Sanibel would cut down the amount of work he'd have to do and increase the work Cutler continued.

Erosion district vice chairman Jack Wick came to Campbell's defense, although he said he did not disagree with Cutler's analysis entirely.

"To some extent he's playing psychiatrist," Zwick said, noting that together Blind Pass committee member Sanibel City Manager Gary Price has accused a group (but is not by Campbell) represents both the erosion district and the inter-management team.

The city of Sanibel has long contended that a July 21 Blind Pass built by Lee County and extended further into the Gulf of Mexico by the erosion district has been the major cause of erosion on a Sanibel's north beach.

Although erosion district administrator Alison Higgins agreed Campbell has been late meeting deadlines set by the ad hoc committee, she also spoke in his defense.

"He's sat here and listened to some pretty insulting things about him," Higgins said.

"It's time we quit considering the feelings of Sanibel," Gary Price wants a great big pile of sand deposited on the Sanibel side of the bridge. He wants to stick his head in it and hope it (the problem) goes away," argued member Doris Bowen.

But despite the City of Sanibel's concerns

and Campbell's request for further work and negotiation, erosion board members decided not to allocate any more funding.

In other news, erosion district members approved a resolution for the next phase of beach maintenance for a cost of \$425,000. Some \$318,750 in funding will be requested from the Department of Natural Resources and \$106,250 will be contributed by the erosion district.

Boat tax demise

The United States Congress voted this week to repeal the boat user fee by a two-thirds majority. The bill will go before the Senate later this year and President George Bush is already threatening to veto the legislation.

The bill, the Shipbuilding Trade Reform Act, which contains the Boat Tax Repeal Act, was authorized by Congress on Porter Cross of Sanibel.

Since Bush has threatened to veto the entire reform act, Goss hoped to make the boat tax repeal a separate bill so if one failed, the other would not.

Separating the bills proved to be unnecessary because the House has more than enough votes to override a presidential veto.

If approved, the legislation would abolish the United States Recreational Vessel Fee, which costs recreational boat owners anywhere from \$25 to \$100 annually.

The program is enforced by the United States Coast Guard, which is authorized to board and cite vessels that do not display their fee sticker.

All fee money collected goes to the United States General Fund, not the coast guard.

Board resignation

Holger S. Smitt resigned from Sanibel's Code Enforcement Board and his decision to leave was accepted with regret by the Sanibel City Council.

Now, the council will ask first alternate Thomas Redford if he would like to become a full board member. If so, someone will be chosen to take Redford's place as alternate.

Smitt resigned because of health reasons.

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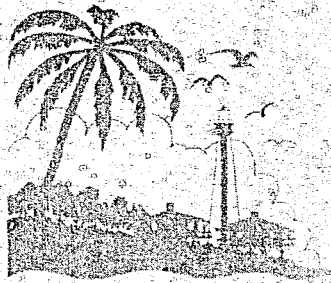
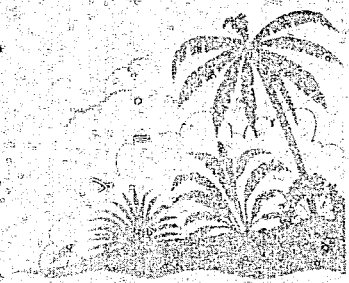
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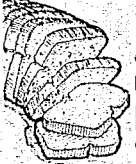

Jail your enemies, bail your friends

As if the Lee County Jail and the local juvenile detention home are not enough of a burden on taxpayers the Southern counterpart of two famous big houses are coming to Lee County Tuesday through Thursday May 19 through 21.

But instead of providing three squares and clean sheets for probable felons faux lockups Alcatraz at Sam Galloway Ford and Sing Sing at First Federal of Fort Myers downtown will incarcerate some of Lee County's leading luminaries and government figures as well as more bosses lawyers and average Joes in a fundraising scheme worthy of the legendary Ponzi a colorful swindler who pioneered pyramid schemes in the early 1900s.

The American Cancer Society's annual Jail and Bull fundraiser works on the premise that upon threat of detention arrested parties are brought before a judge who sets bail based upon the amount of money the person can probably raise.

Given more than the usual one phone call detainees telephone friends and others who pledge bail money toward their release.

Sherri Nowlin of the American Cancer Society office in Fort Myers said the group hopes to raise \$30 000 through this event.

And the tally called this week

Wanted a roster including photos and descriptions of the charges against ten high profile community and business leaders with a number of cancer survivors among them.

The Sanibel most wanted contingent includes Lisa Newmeyer Cochrane of Re Max of the Islands charged with impersonating a realtor Kip Buntrock of Priscilla Murphy Realty photographed hanging upside down from an Australian pine near the Sanibel causeway and last seen hanging around two many happy hours and Dee Congress of Congress Jewelers allegedly last seen dealing hot rocks.

Part of the plea bargain the 10 most wanted cut with the cancer group was each agreed to raise a minimum of \$1 000 in bail.

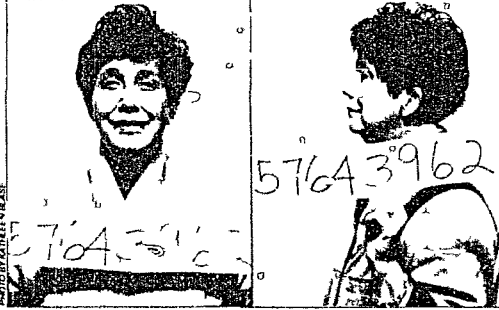
In a way they're more in luck than the average Joe off the street whose arrest can be bought for a \$15 fee.

Unlike Joe the wanted had advance notice of their detainment.

Some like Kip Buntrock of Priscilla Murphy Realty harassed the United State Mail to raise bail.

Last Friday he sent a letter to friends and associates detailing the jail fundraiser his family's battle with the killer disease and asking for donations in the form of bail.

Buntrock was diagnosed with

Mark Loren Designs in Fort Myers made bail with only a few calls.

Loren reportedly made three calls and raised more than \$1 000.

At the urging of Buntrock Newmeyer Cochrane agreed to join the ranks of the most wanted.

And Dee Congress of Congress Jewelers in Periwinkle Place another island most wanted is also a cancer survivor and active in

the society.

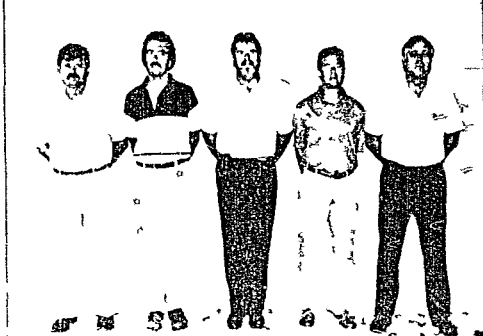
Earlier this week Congress was not sure which lockup she'd visit but knew why she'd be there.

Congress is Lee County's coordinator of Reach to Recovery a support system for women with breast cancer.

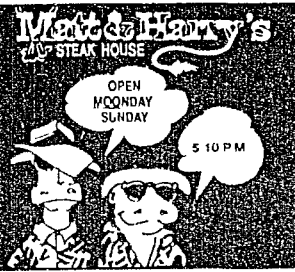

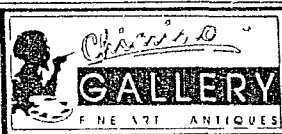

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Shell museum musings

Dr. R. Tucker Abbott, Ph.D. is director of Sanibel's Bailey-Matthews Shell Museum, a noted conchologist and author of many shell books. This column, Shell Museum Musings, appears weekly in The Island Reporter.

There is a difference between research and re-search. This column comes under the category of re-search. We are attempting to give out information by combing past records and publications and sometimes drawing from our own experience and knowledge. This is re-search not true research.

Scientific investigations and experiments that seek out new facts are research. If there appears to be no immediate usefulness or if it is adding to fundamental understanding, we call it basic research. If it attempts to solve a practical problem or if it has some immediate economic value, we call it applied research.

The Bailey-Matthews Shell Museum is primarily a source of natural history information, not a scientific research center, although we are strong advocates of much needed true research. With our attention focused on raising funds to complete our new building on Sanibel Captiva Road, we are not yet in a position to assist others in carrying out research.

Fortunately, there are several organizations already doing much to support mollusk research. Among them are the Sanibel Capiva Shell Club, the Sarasota Shell Club, the Astronaut Trail Shell Club in Melbourne, to mention only the few of the dozen clubs in the United States that grant hundreds and thousands of dollars to worthy research projects of graduate college students.

For years I have been chairman of the Grants Committee of the Conchologists of America, a national group of shell enthusiasts.

Each year our committee, consisting of a representative from each corner of the nation goes over dozens of applications in order to select the best four or five to share in the \$5,000 annually available.

We judge their requests on the basis of the scientific quality of the project, the reasonableness of the expected expenditures, the quality of the investigator, the need for financial support and to a lesser degree, the geographical locations of the applicants' training institutions.

There are two reasons to support research. The most obvious is that it is increasing man's knowledge about himself and his surroundings. Mollusks may be a small part of the parade of nature, but the facts discovered and the lessons learned from them apply to every creature and to every environmental principle.

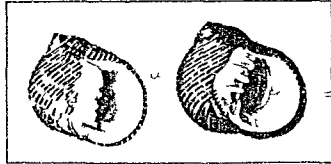
The second reason has an even more immediate and compelling nature. The funding of research, particularly by students, is really the funding of the students themselves and, therefore, supports the scientists of tomorrow. Without this necessary support at a critical time in their early careers, especially in these unsettled times, many a student would fall by the wayside as their research projects withered on the financial vine.

Thank goodness for the support from the Conchologists of America and the shell club, small as it may be, relatively speaking.

Let us take a look at some of this spring's requests. A student from Columbia, South America, and a graduate of the University of South Carolina has been studying the causes of the "brown tide" catastrophe that decimated the bay scallop industry in Long Island.

By doing research on the conditions that favor the attachment of juvenile scallops to seagrass blades, the student hopes to formulate artificial seedings of the new scallops in order to reduce predation by crabs. His research may lead to the recovery of this fishery and point to solutions for Florida's approaching troubles. Request: \$1,500.

Contrast that need with a request from a Hawaiian-born Japanese woman, now a graduate student at the University of Hawaii.



Twenty years ago, well-meaning entomologists introduced Florida's carnivorous *Fugatea* snail to the Pacific Islands in the hope it would attack and destroy the pest-ridden African snail *Achatina*.

To everyone's horror, the Florida snail has ignored the African invader and has been decimating the Hawaiian populations of the beautiful *Achatina Agate Tree Snails*.

A program of rearing these disappearing tree snails is underway, and this student proposes to study the enriched food supply and fecundity of the lab-reared snails. Request: \$1,350.

And so the urgent requests come in: \$1,500 to preserve and study the late Doctor Funnar Thorson's classic 30-year collection of grasshopper egg capsules and more than a thousand exquisite ink drawings of egg masses of 410 species of plants from Cookeville, Tennessee, to \$1,500 to complete a survey of the freshwater mollusks of the tributaries of the Upper Tennessee River before pollution finishes everything off, and a request from a Florida student to study the marine culture of the Pink Conch *Strombus gigas* which serves as a seafood in the West Indies.

Funding of these relatively small research projects may seem like bailing out in Carlos Bay with a scallop shell, but nonetheless the support that shell enthusiasts have been giving over the years is meaningful and encouraging.

Our museum will in due course join these supporters, but our main contribution will be through our exhibits, field trips and educational programs to inspire more naturalists to appreciate the gifts from the seas of Sanibel and Captiva. An increase in the interest in shell life will have a wonderful ripple effect.

Page Turner

Often we remark on a book with a dry, nameless title that is unbelievably mediocre between the covers. An outstanding new show business tome with a title that fails to do it justice is *Hollywood on the Riviera* (Morrow, 1992, \$25).

The subtitle, *The Inside Story of the Cannes Film Festival*, tells what the books about and even a ribby like Page Turner knows that Cannes is a major Hollywood movie festival as the authors point out in a nod to pre-twentieth-century history, the town named for the reeds or canes growing in nearby Mediterranean marshes has been a trading post for well over two thousand years.

That quibble notwithstanding, *Hollywood on the Riviera* makes for a reading experience that is both intellectually stimulating and escapist. Authors Curt Benchamp and Henri Behar, the entertainment journalists who met

at Cannes and formed the enduring friendship that led to this book, the first book-length treatment of the International Film Festival by an American publisher, industry power house Jack Valenti says such friendships are typical of the Cannes experience.

Then there are the romances Rita Hayworth and Aly Khan, Grace Kelly and Prince Rainier are two of the most famous royal alliances that were struck up at the festival which takes place every year two weeks in May.

The first Cannes International Film Festival was scheduled for September 1-20, 1939. *Winged Victory* and *The Hunchback of Notre Dame* were to be screened. Tyton Fower Gary Cooper, Douglas Fairbanks and Mae West were envisioned in their ocean view hotel rooms. But on September 1, Hitler invaded Poland and on September 3 France declared war on Germany and the festival was cancelled.

In 1946 the festival began in earnest in a frenzy of post-war celebration. Even so, the authors explain, the Cold War loomed over the festival throughout its first twenty years, and the titles were marked by political sensitivities that bore the mark of today.

Those of us who are not film fanatics perhaps may some vague ideas of the differences between the Cannes awards and the Oscars we know for instance that Cannes often goes for the movies with a rarer edge. So Cher wins an Oscar for the remittent comedy *Moonstruck* only after receiving the Grand Jury Special Prize for Best Performance by an Actress for her gritty performance in *Misik*.

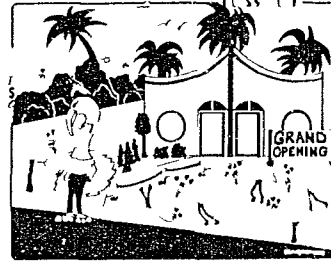
Last year's Elaine Dorr (the tragic) went to Burton Elkin, her first in this country, by only the most pretentious of film records. The 1982 Elaine Dorr went missing by Costi Gavras although the authors assure us the premier of *F.T.* on the 1st night of that year's festival was one of the most magical evenings in festival history. It was greeted with a mixture of applause, cheers and tears of

2,500 movie pros who had become one mind and heart.

The American press tends to cover Cannes in terms of topless starlets. Although there is no doubt this phenomenon accounts for much of the excitement and the queekies consumed in the luxurious hotel suites and yachts anchored off shore are innumerable. Beauchamp and Behar explain it this way: The Cannes Film Festival is a trade show and like RV or plumbing trade shows the real emphasis is on sales. Much of the heavy publicity is publicly oriented toward that purpose.

The authors educate us on the prestige of the various hotels and restaurants, acquaint us with a female curmudgeon named Louise Fargette (officially titled press attaché) who is grande dame of the festival.

The index to the book is not perfect but the Appendix with a complete listing of awards and jurors is *Hollywood on the Riviera* is the kind of book destined to pose prettily for goggle on one's bookshelf but to become well thumbed and wine stained. It seems almost as good as being there.

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Pines may pose danger along Periwinkle Way

Sanibel may take steps to reduce the dangers Australian Pines pose in high wind and storm situations including trimming and removal of the trees along Periwinkle Way.

A great deal could be done and should be done to reduce the wind throw hazard of the trees, said Dr. William Webb, former Sanibel resident and chairman of the board of the Sanibel Captiva Conservation Foundation and retired professor of forestry at Syracuse University who was one of the authors of a paper titled "Vegetation Management Along Periwinkle Way" presented to city council in 1980 and updated in 1987.

Webb was asked to help the committee discuss problems which may be associated with Australian pines along Sanibel's main road and recent requests by businesses to have some of them removed.

A subcommittee was appointed by Jim Levy, chairman of the vegetation committee to study the health and longevity of the Australian pines. Chaired by Shirley Melum, the subcommittee consists of Joan Kohn, Bob Steele and Dr. Bob Stanton and is scheduled to meet Monday June 1 at 10:30 a.m. at city hall.

Webb told regular committee members there are four different styles of cutting removal of the pine leaving just the stump, a crew cut which leaves only stumps for branches in a uniform line, a slash cut which cuts some branches at various levels and se-

lective trimming which leaves some branches and allows for removal of others.

He told committee members pines along Periwinkle Way could be expected to live some 70 more years.

Both Kathy Boone and Dee Searge of the Sanibel Captiva Conservation Foundation's native plant nursery were especially concerned about underplanting around the pines.

I have a problem with some of the clumps of younger pines falling over into a rustic tree I planted about seven years ago, Searge said. Effort and thought should be put into how to manage the new ones that are coming up and crowding and shading the understorey.

Rob Loflin, Sanibel's conservation officer, said it would be a good idea for the city to look into underplanting further.

During the summer he said the city will trim trees but only to keep the branches out of the way of cars, trucks and the bike path cleared. He will be working with Jeff Mangum of the Lee County Forestry Service, who has attended two previous meetings of the vegetation committee concerning Australian pine removal.

Webb observed, "Every tree has to be looked

at by someone who knows something about tree pruning.

But looking individually at these trees (the pines) will cost a lot of money especially a topping program," he said.

Fee hikes okayed

Proposed permit fee increases voted past by the Sanibel Planning Commission which voted without comment at the final hearing to recommend their approval to the Sanibel City Council.

Increases to all permit applications except building permits have been recommended by the city's planning department. During the past seven years there has been one increase to the fee structure.

The proposed schedule will now go before the city council which will also hold two hearings on the matter.

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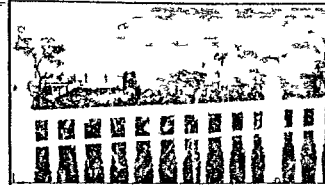

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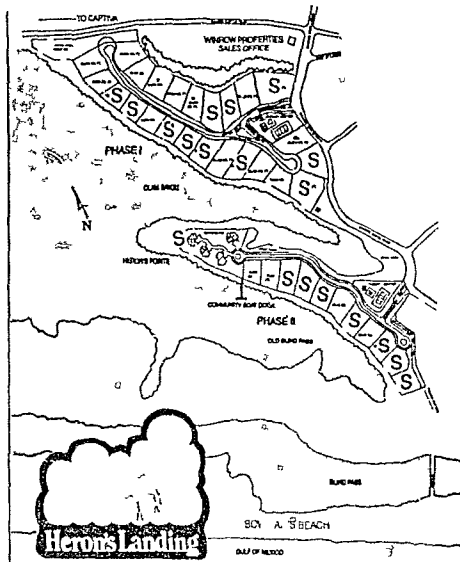
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Islander seeks host families

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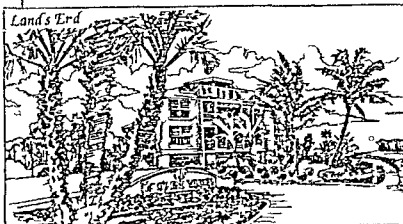
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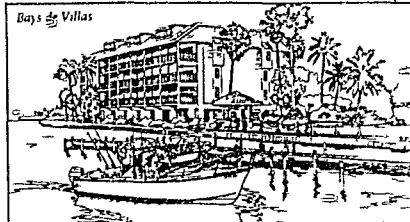

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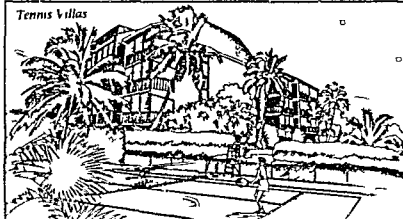

Exhibit depicts best of life centuries ago

The current exhibit of engravings at Edison Community College's Fine Art Gallery is full of surprises and insights.

Most think of Winslow Homer as a down home New Englander who painted tropical artwork scenes. Few realize that before he found fame as a painter, he was a noted illustrator for a number of national weekly magazines.

Homer in fact did not even begin painting until midway through the Civil War.

Through his drawings which were painstakingly engraved in

national news Harpers called it self an illustrated journal of choice reading. In their format's subject matter though not editorially slanted in a particular way, they have corresponded with a news event a holiday or a season. He chronicled the Civil War and with his etchings painted some telling portraits of weary soldiers, those whose names are not in the history books.

Also equally featured are his collage portraits of the women of the war.

Homer captured battles in the joyous moments at war's end.

One particular piece a collage



includes 115 drawings done between 1857 and 1898.

The examples are rare because very few newspapers fit the period are still in existence. The collection is owned by the Cornell Fine Arts Museum at Rollins College.

The then engraving technique for wood was so complicated as it was painstaking.

Homer would usually draw directly on the wood if not he

would use paper and the image would be transferred to the wood.

Then the etchers would go to work carving shallow, well-spaced lines for light shading and deep, close knit lines for darker tones.

These boards would be placed directly in the printing press and were hard enough to survive 100,000 copies.

wood each week the 20th century viewer is offered a unique glimpse of life during the midlife and latter part of the 1800s.

Pre-dating Norman Rockwell by nearly 50 years, Homer's work in black and white and in ide solely by cutting lines in wood is as relevant as romantic and probably more telling than work by the famed master of the Saturday Evening Post.

During Homer's time there was no television nor radio and photography was just in its infancy.

The publications which he worked for included New York's Harpers Weekly and Boston's Bostonian.

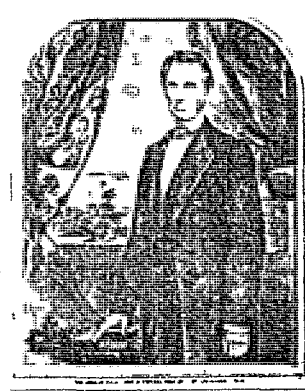
These weekly newspapers were the equivalent of watching the

from 1860-70 has President Abraham Lincoln at the top of the page holding the emancipation doctrine. Also included are war scenes, speeches, schools, farmers, ships and lots of red tape.

Engraved in the picture is the prolific and still relevant poem "Ring out a slow dying cause and ancient forms of party strife Ring in the nobler modes of life with sweeter manners, purer laws. Ring out false pride in place and blood, the chivalry that had the spite Ring in the love of truth and right. Ring in the common sense of God."

But the exhibit does not encompass the Civil War alone. It featured Winslow Homer the illustrator for Harpers Weekly.

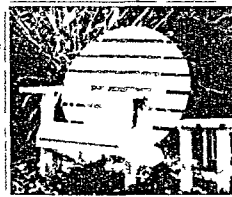

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


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Names in history Alliance engraved bricks for center entrance

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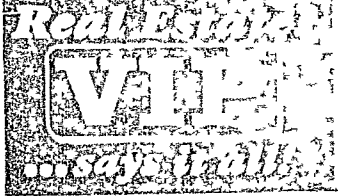

Tarpon, snook, grouper turn on; shark enter bays

Top angling action this week and last was offered by several schools of tarpon, some located in 35 to 40 feet of water, eight to ten miles off the Sanibel lighthouse and others in 22 feet of water three miles off Pointe Santo de Sanibel condominium.

Herb Ferguson, at Sanibel Marina, said schools of tarpon located from eight to 10 miles off the Sanibel lighthouse are keeping guides and charters busy.

Because the water is somewhat chilly for this time of year the tarpon are staying deep, he added.

Sanibel resident Paul Primeaux turned a triple, last Wednesday, a warmer week weather-wise, when he jumped, caught and released three tarpon between 130 and 145 pounds just off the Pointe Santo where he had a school all to himself.

Primeaux caught the tarpon on 30, 40 and 50 pound test using cut-up staid fished on the bottom.

That day he also caught and released two blacktip sharks, the largest five feet long. And last Friday afternoon he jumped two tarpon in 28 feet of water.

Primeaux reported seeing lots of blacktip, hammerhead and lemon sharks as well.

Snook have been caught in the passes as well as offshore according to Nan Hall at The Ball Box.

Sanibel resident Mike Calinski hooked into 39 and 40-inch snook while fishing near a wreck two miles off Redfish Pass Sunday, Hall said.

Sharks have entered the nursery waters of Pine Island Sound to bear young, she added, explaining the large number of this species found in the sound at this time of year.

Dave Jensen, at Jensen's Twin Palms resort and marina, said three large snook, two less than 40 inches and one longer than 40 inches, were caught with pinfish off the beach at Blind Pass this weekend.

Fair-size grouper have also been caught in the passes, Jensen added.

John Renfrow of Jacksonville, a guest at Jensen's, caught two 25 inch grouper in Captiva Pass with live bait Saturday.

Cobia put in an appearance this week. Captain Dave Gibson reportedly caught a 65 pound cobia in back bay waters during the weekend and Captain Dave Case caught two large cobia in the same area Sunday.

Cobia were also caught at the Sanibel pier Saturday night, according to Hall at The Ball Box.

Marilee Eckartz, at Boyside Marina at South Seas Plantation, said tarpon and shark have been caught over the grass flats in Pine

Island Sound.

Captain Jerry Way, at Tween Waters marina, said snook and grouper have been caught in the passes and with tide changes this week came good tarpon action in the bay.

Last week, before the cold front passed through, fishing was fast in Tarpon Bay according to Chip Hoffman at Tarpon Bay boat rentals.

Trout in the 20 to 24 inch range were caught in front of the marina store, at markers 4 and 5, and at the mouth of the canoe trail.

Unusually large numbers of redfish were caught and released by anglers fishing the mangroves.

Snook fishing was good before the front and should improve in the coming week as temperatures warm, Hoffman added.
