Past State President John Tedesco was the M.C. for the evening and did a great job talking about our honoree. Maria is a native San Franciscan born to Italian parents. Besides the usual school studies Maria studied voice and piano and has won many wards for her talents. She joined the Sons of Italy in 1972 as a member of the Cornelia-Vita Nuova Lodge. She has been an active member of the American Italian community for 45 years. She served many levels in the Order - - -Queen Contest coordinator, State Orator, State First Vice President and in 2009 she became the second woman to be the State President, a position she held for four years. On the National level she has served as a National Trustee and is currently a Trustee of the Sons of Italy representing California.

Besides her public involvement with the Italian community she is a well known operatic soprano. She has sung for the San Francisco Giants, the Oakland A's and the Golden Warriors as well as in front of United State dignitaries and Italian ones.

In 2001 Maria was honored when she was bestowed the rank of Cavalieri and in 2015 she became Commendatory nell'Ordine della Stella d'Italia by the Italian Ambassador to the United States on behalf

of the Italian government for her work in the Italian community.

Maria is married to Ugo Pignati, Past State Financial Secretary and they live in San Mateo. They have one son, Michael, who is married to Julie and they have two sons, Luca and Gino. Maria and Ugo do a lot of baby sitting.

More Italian Trivia: Anthony Talamo Rossi (September 13, 1900 - January 24, 1993) was an Italian immigrant who founded Tropicana Products, a producer of orange juice founded in 1947 in Bradenton, Florida which grew from 50 employees to over 8,000 in 2004, expanding into multiple product lines and became one of the world's largest producers and marketers of citrus juice. Rossi was also an early pioneer in the inclusion of Florida's citrus juices in school meal programs. He also became a noted religiously-oriented businessman, making annual pilgrimages to Sicily where he helped build a church and mission. In the U.S. he married Sana Barlow and endowed the Aurora Foundation, which has funded various Christian programs. Until next month.

A witch was once believed to be a weird person who summoned demons and spirits and made them do evil deeds. It was said she sold her soul to the devil. She was hunted by the Inquisition.

Witchcraft hysteria swept the New England colonies in the early 1690s. Everyone was subject to suspicion. Some colonists made false confessions, such as riding broomsticks and putting the "evil eye" on men, women, children, and animals. Twenty men and women were executed before the hysteria

Today, the witch is an iconic image of Halloween. The witch has attained a new image. The modern belief in Wicca derives in part from ancient and medieval witchcraft. Many Wiccans worship a pre-Christian Mother Goddess and practice ceremonial magic. Wicca is a Neo-pagan, occult nature religion. It is promoted as empowerment young women. The public has widespread accessibility to Wiccan materials through books and the Internet.

The rituals of "Stregheria" are similar to Wicca. Stregheria is an Italian witchcraft religion. It was popularized in the 1980s by the author Raven Grimassi. He claims that it evolved within the ancient Etruscan religion of Italian peasants who worked for the Catholic upper classes. Many of its followers celebrate a series of eight festivals similar to Wicca; others celebrate the ancient Roman festivals.

Stregheria has an element of ancestor worship through spirits known as "lares." The pentagram is its most identifying symbol. Stregheria is sometimes referred to as La Vecchia Religione (The Old Religion).

In the 1970s Italian-American Leo Martello claimed in his book "Witchcraft: The Old Religion" to belong to a family tradition of witchcraft. Martello does not use the word "Stregheria" when referring to the practice, but refers to it as the "Strega tradition."

Witches are often depicted with brooms. The broom has been associated with female magic and wise-women since ancient Rome. Sacred midwives used special brooms to sweep the thresholds of houses after childbirth to repel evil influences from mothers and their ba-

The witch was and still is a popular character in folklore and art. The witch Circe in Homer's "Odyssey" is one of literature's most famous witches. The Cumaean Sibvl is another. Sibyl's books were consulted by the rulers of ancient Rome in times of emergency. The biblical witch of Endor in the First Book of Samuel is widely known. Spiritualists have taken the story as evidence of spirit mediumship in ancient times. William Shakespeare wrote about witches. Scholars of literature study his great drama "Macbeth."

Commission For Social Justice

Brothers and Sisters: As you all may be aware by now, the Los Angeles City Council eliminated Columbus Day and replaced it with Indigenous People's Day. We must remember Los Angeles' City Council' vote did not diminish our desire to recognize Columbus and our heritage. Columbus Day is still recognized by other cities and counties in California including the County of Los Angeles. Although in 2009, former California Governor Arnold Schwarzenegger got rid of the Columbus Day state holiday as part of a budget cutting measure and not because of a political agenda.

Columbus Day was proclaimed a national holiday by President Franklin D Roosevelt on September 18, 1937. This has not been changed or been eliminated and is still recognized by the United States Government as a day honoring the Genovese Navigator's journey that ultimately led to the actual discovery and immigration to America by many European nations. We do acknowledge what had transpired during the explorations of Columbus, but the conquistadors from Spain and explorers from other nations were predominantly responsible for the demise and affliction of the indigenous people.

Many of us feel devastated and our culture humiliated by the procedures of the Los Angeles city Council. Other cities and states throughout our country have collaborated with a politically motivated movement that gained momentum by elaborating on the concerns of Native Americans. Many of the Native Americans involved with eliminating Columbus from history are descendants of the Spanish conquistadors who conquered and eliminated their culture.

Unfortunately, it has become an agenda using political and media pressure awareness of their own cultural issues that has really nothing to do with Columbus himself. Because of the contention surrounding Columbus's legacy, some states have chosen to celebrate alternatives to Columbus Day or not observing it at all.

We must remain cognizant that Italian-Americans throughout the United States are being misplaced by the new millennial's who have lost interest in our culture. We have taken a second seat to other cultures who have escalated their agendas to change political

opinions and amplify their strategy.

The OSIA's Commission for Social Justice along with the Knights of Columbus and other Italian-American organizations have presented alternatives to the elimination of Columbus Day. The truth is there is no palpable idealism that Columbus himself had a legacy of genocide, slavery and of unsubstantiated brutality. Apparently, some of the historians never took the time to read Columbus's journals that dispelled many of the myths that have plagued his historical voyages and findings. A quote I recently received from a friend explained the direction of historians and educators who are teaching our youth: "Beware of the man whose level of education exceeds his ability to reason."

Kevin A. Caira, President, Commission of Social Justice for the Order Sons of Italy has taken a compelling position attempting to reason with various politicians and organizations throughout the United States to recognize the plights of the indigenous natives and provide them with an alternate date for their own recognition. Mr. Caira called on other lodges throughout the United States to support our movement here in California and they obliged. They organized their members to support our cause by telephoning and writing Los Angeles City Councilman to support our efforts. The California Grand Lodge along with the lodges in the Los Angeles area fiercely opposed the move but to no avail. Those opposing Columbus Day were well organized and financially supported. The city Council was not interested in listening to any opposition and had their decision to support Native Americans already formulated.

Activists throughout the United States will continue to pursue their agenda and eliminate Columbus Day. Our own lodges must be vigilant of any attempts by other cities or counties in their areas that are contemplating or in the political process of encouraging the elimination of Columbus Day. There is no doubt that we will be going through this again and we must be prepared, organized and willing to participate in any forum to protect our culture. We in turn must support our brothers and sisters who will be encountering these issues in other

cities and states.
