CINEMATOGRAPHY IN HUNGARY.

(Trans. covered, said, at advance, written). The cinematograph business in Hungary has been so successful that there are seven theaters in this city of 51,000 inhabitants. In Szasz, population 10,000, which is a part of Buda, there is also one. Some 15 very large. There have a seating capacity of 150 persons each, and the largest 270. The newest one was started last February in a new building on the principal street. This has a seating capacity of 324, having boxes for twelve persons, a gallery seating 102, and a hall for 210 second and third class. Special space is provided for waiting rooms, and the program are given every hour from 8 till 10, and persons are not allowed to enter during their rendition. The program usually consists of a three or four act drama, and is comedy. In one cinematograph three reels are given, but the main one is a short drama. In one a vaudeville act also is given. One of the vaudeville acts is a short play in moving picture show from 2 to 8. The programs in most places are shown three times a week. The cost of a film varies according to the number of times it has been presented. The first week it costs nine cents per meter (327 feet); the second, seven; the third, five; the fourth, four; the fifth, three; the sixth, two; the seventh, one; the eighth, one-half; the ninth, one-quarter; ## OLGA NETHERSOLE WINS SUIT.

### JURY AWARDS FULL AMOUNT OF CLAIM.

Olga Nethersole was given a verdict for \$22,217.82 by a jury, in the New York courts, on Friday, Nov. 21. The suit, which required several days, was brought by Miss Nethersole against the Shubert Theatre Co. and Leslie & Co., under whose management she appeared during 1910.

The evidence at trial detailed the fact that Miss Nethersole was brought to the United States by the defendants under a contract whereby she was to receive \$10,000 a week and a percentage of profits for two seasons of thirty weeks each, in 1910 and 1911. After fulfilling this contract for the first year the Shubert Co. and the Leslie

Co. failed to send her out for the second year. The damages claimed included an unpaid balance of her first year's salary, the full amount called for in the second year's contract with interest.

It was also shown at the trial that there had been no special contract drawn between the defendants and Miss Nethersole issued her suit on subpoenas and letters from the defendants, and Supreme Court Justice Fuldston instructed the jury that contracts could be established by such writings.

A verdict of appeal was served by counsel for the defendants.
