

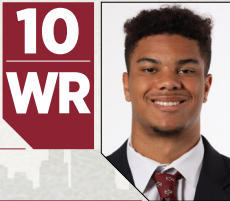

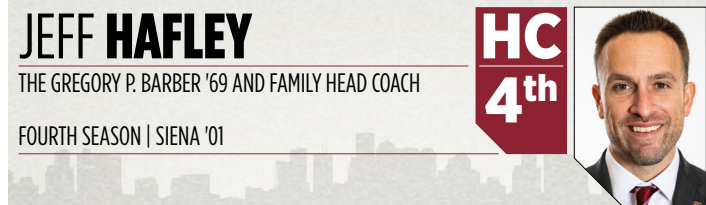

Jeff Hafley was introduced as The Gregory P. Barber '69 and Family Head Coach of the Boston College football program on Dec. 14, 2019.

On the recruiting trail, Hafley and his staff have signed two of the top recruiting classes in school history. The 2021 and 2022 signing classes earned ESPN's best ranking in program history since its rankings began in 2006. BC also earned its best showing in the 247 Sports rankings and was awarded its first Rivals top-30 class since 2004.

In 2022, Hafley and the Eagles picked up the program's first win over a ranked opponent since 2018 and first over an AP-ranked opponent since 2014 when BC upset No. 16 NC State on the road. The season was highlighted by wide receiver Zay Flowers rewriting the Boston College record book. Flowers set BC single-season and career records in receptions, receiving yards and receiving touchdowns.

Flowers became the fourth All-American under Hafley as he earned recognition from the Associated Press. He also led the Eagles' seven-player All-ACC contingent as a first-team pick.

One of college football's top defensive minds, Hafley's defense ranked third nationally in passing yards allowed (173.5 per game) during the 2021 season. The Eagles were also top-30 nationally in six other defensive categories: total defense, red zone defense, first downs allowed, third down percentage, team passing efficiency, and defensive touchdowns. His disciplined squad led the ACC in fewest penalties and fewest penalty yards.

A total of 12 Eagles were All-ACC selections, led by First Team offensive linemen Zion Johnson and Alec Lindstrom. Johnson was named to seven different All-America teams and was selected 17th overall in the first round of the 2022 NFL Draft by the Los Angeles Chargers, becoming the 21st first round pick in school history.

In his first season on the Heights in 2020, Hafley finished with the most victories of any first-year head coach in college football. More impressive than the marked improvement on both sides of the ball from Boston College in 2020 was how the program handled playing in the COVID-19 pandemic. BC's team had just one positive COVID-19 result in over 9,000 administered tests since the team returned to campus in June of 2020.

Hafley helped improve BC's defense 52 spots in the national rankings in total defense as the Eagles allowed 62 fewer yards per game than the previous year, prior to his arrival. Isaiah McDuffie ranked fifth nationally in total tackles while Max Richardson ended the season 11th as Boston College was one of two schools in the entire country with two players finishing in the top 11 in tackles.

Nine Eagles were named All-ACC in 2020, including the first wide receiver to be named All-ACC First Team in Zay Flowers since 2012. Tight end Hunter Long was named a Second Team All-American by multiple outlets as he led all tight ends nationally in receptions and finished the year second in receptions.

Prior to taking over as head coach at Boston College, Hafley led a dramatic turnaround in leading the defense for Ohio State as the Buckeyes won the 2019 Big Ten Championship and qualified for the College Football Playoff. A finalist for the Frank Broyles Award and the 247 Sports Defensive Coordinator of the Year, Hafley was one of the architects of a Buckeye defense that ranked first nationally in yards per play, second nationally in total defense, third nationally in scoring defense, third nationally in sacks, seventh nationally in rushing defense, second nationally in passing yards allowed and first nationally in red zone defense.

A standout defensive backs coach throughout his career, Hafley's work as the defensive backs coach at Ohio State led to impressive results. The Buckeyes totaled 15 interceptions in 2019, tied for ninth nationally, while allowing just 25 pass plays of 20+ yards.

Before arriving at Ohio State, Hafley spent the previous seven seasons in the NFL, the last three with the San Francisco 49ers as defensive backs coach.

Prior to his time with San Francisco, Hafley was the secondary coach for two seasons in Cleveland, the secondary/safeties coach with Tampa Bay in 2013 and a defensive backs assistant with the Buccaneers in 2012.

His coaching career includes 11 seasons in collegiate football before a move to the NFL, and then seven subsequent seasons there. After starting his career as the running backs coach for one season (2001) at Worcester (Mass.) Polytechnic Institute, Hafley moved on to the University of Albany for four seasons as defensive assistant and defensive backs coach (2002-05).

He then coached at the University of Pittsburgh for five seasons (2006-10) where he worked under the direction of Dave Wannstedt and helped mentor Darrelle Revis into a Jim Thorpe Award finalist in 2006. Hafley was a defensive assistant/cornerbacks coach in 2006-07 and was secondary coach from 2008-10.

One season as the defensive backs coach at Rutgers, working under Greg Schiano, followed his positions at Pittsburgh. The Scarlet Knights ranked ninth nationally in passing defense in his one season there, 2011. Hafley helped develop future NFL standout defensive backs Duron Harmon and Logan Ryan during his time in Piscataway.

Hafley moved on to the NFL following his year at Rutgers and coached two seasons with the Buccaneers, serving as assistant defensive backs coach in 2012 and secondary/safeties coach in 2013. Two seasons with the Cleveland Browns followed under coach Mike Pettine.

Three seasons as defensive backs coach with the San Francisco 49ers – 2016, 2017 and 2018 – preceded Hafley's position with the Buckeyes. He worked under Chip Kelly in 2016 and under Kyle Shanahan the final two seasons. In 2018, the 49ers ranked 11th in the league in passing defense. They were 14th in 2016 after ranking 27th in 2015, the year before Hafley arrived.

Hafley and his wife, Gina, have two daughters, Hope and Leah.

Aazaar Abdul-Rahim enters his fourth season at BC and first as co-defensive coordinator, while retaining his coaching responsibilities with the Eagle defensive backs. He was elevated to the position in February of 2023 by head coach Jeff Hafley.

A pair of BC defensive backs earned All-ACC honors in 2022 with cornerback Elijah Jones and safety Jaiden Woodbey claiming Honorable Mention. As a team, the BC secondary was fifth in the ACC at 211.1 passing yards allowed per game.

Abdul-Rahim and his secondary helped BC rank third nationally in passing yards allowed (173.5 per game) during the 2021 season. The Eagles were also top-30 nationally in six other defensive categories: total defense, red zone defense, first downs allowed, third down percentage, team passing efficiency, and defensive touchdowns.

Abdul-Rahim has overseen the development of Josh DeBerry into an All-ACC cornerback. DeBerry was named All-ACC Honorable Mention in 2020 and earned All-ACC Second Team honors in 2021. Cornerback Brandon Sebastian earned a spot on the All-ACC Third Team.

In his first season, Abdul-Rahim made an impact in coaching the Eagles' defensive backs and helping improve the defense 52 spots in the national rankings in total defense. Boston College allowed 62 fewer yards per game on defense in 2020 compared to the previous year.

Abdul-Rahim came to the Heights after spending the 2019 season at UMass as defensive coordinator and cornerbacks coach. Prior to UMass, Abdul-Rahim spent three seasons at Maryland working in the secondary. In addition to his coaching duties, Abdul-Rahim was instrumental in the Terps' recruiting efforts. He was a key factor in Maryland signing a consensus top-20 recruiting class in 2017 and a top-30 group in 2018. As a result, Abdul-Rahim was recognized by 247Sports in 2018 as one of the top recruiting assistant coaches in the Big Ten.

Abdul-Rahim joined the Maryland staff in 2016 after a two-year stint at Alabama where he first served as a defensive analyst in 2014 before he was promoted to the assistant director of player personnel in 2015. During his two seasons at Alabama, the Crimson Tide were selected for the College Football Playoffs in both years and won the national championship in 2015.

Abdul-Rahim played three seasons at San Diego State (1997-1999) after a stint at Mesa Community College. He also played for the San Diego Riptide of the Arena Football League.

Matt Applebaum returned to BC as offensive line coach for his second stint on the Heights in 2023. He previously served as the Eagles' offensive line coach from 2020-21.

Applebaum spent the 2022 season in the NFL as the Miami Dolphins' offensive line coach; helping Miami to its first playoff appearance in six years. The Dolphins allowed five fewer sacks than the previous season and improved their rushing average from 3.5 yards per carry to 4.3; an improvement of nine spots in the league rankings.

During his initial stint at BC, Applebaum coached nine All-ACC selections and a pair of All-Americans in Zion Johnson, who was selected in the first round of the 2022 NFL Draft, and Alec Lindstrom. The entire starting offensive line earned All-ACC in 2021.

In 2021, Boston College averaged 165.2 rushing yards per game and allowed 2.17 sacks per game, which ranked fourth best in the ACC. The 2020 offensive line gained four All-ACC nods with Lindstrom claiming his first of two first-team picks. The line started all 11 games together and contributed to the third-ranked passing attack in the ACC at 284.2 yards per game.

Applebaum spent the 2018-19 seasons at Towson as offensive line coach. Applebaum's unit helped protect quarterback Tom Flacco, who was named CAA Offensive Player of the Year. The Tigers had the top scoring (34.5) and total (465.0) offense in the CAA that season. Applebaum spent the 2016-17 seasons at Davidson, where he coached the offensive line. He was promoted to offensive coordinator/offensive line in 2017.

Applebaum has five years of NFL experience. He was an offensive assistant for Jacksonville in 2014 and spent three seasons (2008-10) with Washington in a variety of roles. He joined Washington in 2008 as a pro personnel assistant before being promoted to college personnel assistant in 2009 and moving into coaching as an offensive assistant in 2010.

Applebaum was a two-year starter on the offensive line at Connecticut, where he graduated with a bachelor's degree in political science. He and his wife, Bethany, have a son, Colton.

Rob Chudzinski moved into an on-field coaching role with Boston College in 2023 after serving as special assistant to the head coach for Jeff Hafley's first three seasons. Chudzinski moved into the role of associate head coach for offense and offensive development.

Chudzinski is tasked with implementing the scheme and developing players and staff in the team's offensive vision and philosophy. He returns to the coaching ranks with 12 years of experience in the college game, including 2020-22 at BC, plus 14 years of NFL experience; most notably as head coach of the Cleveland Browns in 2013.

Chudzinski guided the Browns for one season; going 4-12 in 2013. He gained offensive coordinator experience at the professional level in his second of three stints in Cleveland during the 2007 and 2008 seasons as well as two years with the Carolina Panthers (2011-12) and three years with the Indianapolis Colts (2015-17). Chudzinski was initially hired by the Colts in 2014 as their associate head coach following the 2013 season in Cleveland. His first offensive coordinator opportunity came at his alma mater, the University of Miami, from 2001-03; overseeing the Hurricanes' BCS National Championship offense.

Chudzinski played tight end at the University of Miami, where he was a three-year starter. He was a part of two National Championship teams in 1987 and 1989. Chudzinski got his coach in starting at his alma mater as a graduate assistant from 1994-95. He then moved to tight ends coach from 1996-00 before being elevated to offensive coordinator from 2001-03.

In his first season running the offense in 2001, Chudzinski played a large part in the Hurricanes' National Championship. He coached three All-America tight ends and guided a 2001 offense that featured running backs Clinton Portis and Frank Gore as well as wide receiver Andre Johnson and tight end Jeremy Shockey with quarterback Ken Dorsey under center.

Former Boston College linebacker Sean Duggan enters his fourth season as BC's linebackers coach and first as co-defensive coordinator; a position he was promoted to under head coach Jeff Hafley in February 2023. Duggan, who played in 45 career games during his career with the Eagles, served as captain of the 2014 Boston College squad.

Vinny DePalma ranked 15th in the ACC in tackles in 2022 with a team-high 87. He became the fourth linebacker under Duggan's tutelage to earn All-ACC recognition.

Isaiah Graham-Mobley ranked 28th in the ACC in tackles during the 2021 season, despite missing three games due to injury. He averaged 5.8 tackles per game and signed as a free agent with the Carolina Panthers following the 2022 NFL Draft.

In his first season back at the Heights, Duggan oversaw a unit that featured two of the nation's leading tacklers. Isaiah McDuffie led BC and ranked fifth in the nation with 107 tackles in 2020. He ranked 30th nationally with 9.7 tackles per game and was an All-ACC Second Team selection. The Green Bay Packers selected McDuffie in the sixth round of the 2021 NFL Draft. Max Richardson earned All-ACC Third Team honors after finishing second on the team and fourth in the ACC with 99 tackles.

Duggan joined the Ohio State defensive staff in 2019 and served as a graduate assistant coach. He was a key part of an Ohio State defensive staff that ranked first nationally in yards per play (3.9), second nationally in total defense (247.6 yards per game), third nationally in scoring defense (12.5 points per game), third nationally in sacks (3.92 per game), seventh nationally in rushing defense (99.5 yards per game), second nationally in passing yards allowed (148.1 yards per game) and first nationally in red zone defense (64.2%).

Prior to Ohio State, Duggan spent one season at UMass as linebackers coach in 2018. During his stay in Amherst, he mentored Bryton Barr, a New England Football Writers Association (NEFWA) All-Region Team selection. Barr was also the ECAC Defensive Player of the Year.

Duggan served on the University of Hawai'i staff as linebackers coach for the 2016 and 2017 seasons. While at Hawai'i, Duggan guided a host of successful Rainbow Warriors, including 2016 All-Mountain West First Team choice Jahlani Tavai and NFL-bound Jerrol Garcia-Williams.

Duggan joined the BC staff in 2015 as the team's defensive graduate assistant and helped the unit produce the nation's top total defense and No. 4 scoring defense (15.3 points/game).

As a player, Duggan played in 45 career games and was a captain in 2014. Duggan finished his BC career with 115 career tackles, 6.5 TFLs, two interceptions and two fumble recoveries.

Savon Huggins begins his second season as running backs coach at Boston College in 2022.

He arrived on the Heights for the 2021 season after a brief stint as the running backs coach at Massachusetts. The former Rutgers running back worked with BC backs in the fall.

Huggins helped running back Pat Garwo earn a spot on the All-ACC Second Team along with All-New England honors. Garwo was the No. 4 rusher in the ACC with 1,045 yards, becoming the 19th BC player to rush for 1,000 yards in a season. Garwo had four 100-yard rushing performances and scored seven touchdowns on the ground in 2021. In 2022, Garwo put up career numbers as a receiver out of the backfield with 29 catches; ranking second on the team behind All-American Zay Flowers.

Huggins got his start in coaching at Somerville (N.J.) High School, gained experience as an intern with the Miami Dolphins, and broke into the college ranks at Buffalo in 2020 as a wide receivers assistant.

At Somerville, Huggins worked as an assistant on offense and defense as the team posted a cumulative 32-3 record between 2016-18 and won a state title in 2017. Following a fellowship with the Dolphins, he returned to his alma mater of St. Peter's Prep (N.J.) to win a state title as an offensive assistant.

As a player, Huggins spent four seasons at Rutgers and earned his degree in economics in three and a half years. He missed his senior year due to injury after compiling 842 rushing yards, nine touchdowns and 20 receptions in his first three seasons. The Scarlet Knights played in a bowl game in all four years of his career. He was named to the Big Ten All-Academic Team in 2014.

Huggins went on to earn his master's degree from Northern Iowa in sports psychology. He ran 59 times for 232 yards with a pair of rushing touchdowns and a receiving touchdown during the 2015 season.

Vince Oghobaase begins his fourth season as the defensive line coach at Boston College. A former standout at Duke, Oghobaase returned to the ACC after a two-year stint at UCLA.

Oghobaase helped BC rank third nationally in passing yards allowed (173.5 per game) during the 2021 season. The Eagles were also top-30 nationally in six other defensive categories: total defense, red zone defense, first downs allowed, third down percentage, team passing efficiency, and defensive touchdowns. BC ranked fifth in the ACC a year later in passing yards allowed (211.2) and improved from 1.67 sacks per game to 2.25.

In 2022, defensive end Donovan Ezeiruaku was named an All-ACC Second Team pick with 8.5 sacks and 14.5 tackles for loss; both the most by an Eagle since 2018. Defensive tackle Chibueze Onwuka also earned All-ACC Honorable Mention.

Oghobaase became UCLA's defensive line coach in 2018. He joined the Bruin staff after working the previous two seasons in the NFL as the 49ers' assistant defensive line coach.

In year two at UCLA, the Bruin defensive front helped cut almost 0.5 yards per carry off of the opponent rushing average per carry from the previous season and held four teams under 100 yards rushing. The defense upped its sack total from 11 to 26 over a year's time. Osa Odighizuwa led Bruin linemen with 46 tackles and added a team-high tying 10.0 tackles for loss.

Prior to his time in the NFL, Oghobaase served as a defensive graduate assistant at Ohio State for three years. During his tenure at Ohio State, he tutored defensive end Joey Bosa, who registered 26.0 career sacks, the third most in school history.

Oghobaase began his coaching career as a defensive graduate assistant at Duke in 2011, and helped the Blue Devils earn the program's first bowl game appearance since 1994.

Oghobaase was a four-year starter as a player at Duke from 2006-09. He registered 165 tackles during his career, and finished his career ranked sixth in school history in both sacks (14.0) and tackles for loss (36.5). During his college career, Oghobaase earned Freshman All-American honors in 2006 and was twice named honorable mention All-ACC (2008-09). He received third-team All-America honors from The Sporting News in 2009.

A native of Houston, Texas, Oghobaase graduated from Duke in 2010 with a degree in sociology and signed a free agent contract with the Miami Dolphins after attending the NFL Scouting Combine.

Paul Rhoads, former head coach at Iowa State, was added to the 2023 staff as the outside linebackers coach. He brings 32 years of experience in the college game and spent the fall of 2022 as the defensive coordinator at Gulf Shores High School in Alabama; where he helped Gulf Shores to an 11-2 season, while earning Alabama 5A Assistant Coach of the Year.

In the college ranks, Rhoads most recently held a defensive analyst position with Ohio State in 2021 following the 2020 season at Arizona as the Wildcats' defensive coordinator. He previously coached defensive backs at UCLA (2018-19) and Arkansas (2016-17), where he was also the defensive coordinator for one season.

In seven seasons at Iowa State (2009-15), Rhoads guided the Cyclones to a 32-55 record and three bowl game appearances. ISU went 7-6 in his first season and won the Insight Bowl over Minnesota. The Cyclones also reached bowl games after six-win seasons in 2011 and 2012.

Rhoads helped Iowa State snap an 11-game Big 12 losing streak with a win over Baylor in his first season and guided the Cyclones to their first road win at Nebraska since 1977 en route to becoming the first ISU coach in nearly a century to win six or more games in his initial season.

Iowa State gained its first-ever win over Texas in 2010 as the Cyclones upended the No. 22 Longhorns, 28-21. The 2011 season was highlighted by a lopsided upset at No. 19 Texas Tech in a 512-yard effort for the ISU offense. Later that season, Iowa State earned an overtime win against No. 2 Oklahoma State; the program's first win over a top-six AP-ranked opponent.

Hafley and Rhoads worked together for two seasons at Pitt, where Rhoads was the defensive coordinator from 2000-07. During that eight-year stretch, five of Rhoads' defenses ranked in the nation's top-30 for scoring, while three finished in the top-12 for fewest yards allowed.

Rhoads and his wife Vickie have two sons; Jake and Wyatt.

Steve Shimko enters his fourth season at Boston College and first as offensive coordinator. Shimko coached tight ends in his first two seasons with the Eagles before serving as quarterbacks coach in 2022.

In the final four weeks of the 2022 season, redshirt freshman quarterback Emmett Morehead made the first starts of his career. Having been elevated to second-string under Shimko's direction, Morehead stepped in and threw for four touchdowns and 330 yards in his first start. Morehead went on to record two games of 325-plus yards and three-plus touchdowns as he became one of just two freshmen (true or redshirt) QBs in the country to reach those marks in multiple games.

During the 2021 season, Shimko helped mentor transfer Trae Barry into an All-ACC tight end. Barry earned Honorable Mention honors after ranking sixth in the ACC with 17.2 yards per reception while adding four receiving touchdowns. He earned a rookie mini-camp invite from the Arizona Cardinals.

In his first season at the Heights, Shimko made an immediate impact as he helped develop tight end Hunter Long into one of the leading tight ends in college football in 2020. Long became the highest drafted Boston College tight end in school history after the Miami Dolphins selected him in the third round of the 2021 NFL Draft. He was named a Second Team All-American by five major outlets in 2020.

Prior to BC, the New Jersey native helped tutor Russell Wilson as he was named to the Pro Football Writers Association All-NFL team for the first time in 2019. Wilson finished the season throwing for 4,110 yards and 31 touchdowns with just five interceptions. He had a passer rating of 106.3 in leading the Seahawks to the NFL Divisional Playoffs.

Shimko joined Seattle after two seasons (2016-17) as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Garden City (Kan.) Community College where he won the NJACC National Championship in his first season. Prior to Garden City, he spent one season each at the University of Georgia (2015), Western Michigan (2014) and his alma mater, Rutgers (2013).

Shimko played quarterback at Rutgers but a shoulder injury cut short his career. Under NCAA rules, he became a student assistant under head coach Greg Schiano until graduating with a degree in criminal justice & labor relations.

Matt Thurin enters year four as special teams coordinator and defensive assistant working with the BC safeties. Thurin came to the Heights after a five-year stint at Ohio State.

Boston College's 2022 special teams unit was one of just four in the ACC to block two or more kicks. A blocked extra-point against Louisville proved to be the difference in the Eagles' first league win of the season.

In 2021, Connor Lytton was second in the ACC and 11th nationally in field goal percentage. Grant Carlson ranked top-30 nationally in punt average (44.2) while Travis Levy ranked second in the ACC and 15th nationally in kick return average (27.5).

In his first season at the Heights, Thurin made a major impact in the improvement of Boston College's special teams. BC finished 34th nationally in field goal percentage in 2020, the best finish for the Eagles since 2013.

Aaron Boumerhi converted 16-of-20 of his field goal attempts while Grant Carlson averaged over 42 yards per punt, including 15 punts pinned inside the 20-yard line.

Thurin worked together with BC head coach Jeff Hapley for one season with the Buckeyes as Thurin worked with the safeties and on special teams as a defensive quality control coach.

Thurin was part of three consecutive Big Ten Conference championship teams at Ohio State and also victories in the 2019 Rose Bowl, the 2018 Cotton Bowl and the 2016 Fiesta Bowl.

A native of Louisville, Ohio, Thurin attended Baldwin Wallace University where he played football and baseball before an injury ended his playing career. He played for Baldwin Wallace's 2003 Division III playoff team and graduated in 2007 with a degree in early childhood education. He has a master's in education from Akron (2009).

Thurin came to Columbus after working three seasons, 2012-14, as secondary coach and special team's coordinator at Columbia University. In 2011, Thurin was a graduate assistant at the University of Colorado, working along the offensive line and on special teams. Prior to that, he spent three seasons at Akron as a defensive graduate assistant working with the Zip linebackers and secondary. Thurin's coaching career also includes a year at Walsh University.

Darrell Wyatt was introduced as the Eagles' wide receivers coach at the start of Boston College's 2022 spring practices. He added passing game coordinator responsibilities in 2023.

Wyatt helped oversee the evolution of Zay Flowers into a first-round NFL draft pick in 2023. Flowers was featured heavily in the BC offense as he set the single-season and career program records for receiving touchdowns and receptions and posted the fourth 1,000-yard season in BC history. Flowers was an All-ACC First Team pick and Associated Press All-American.

Wyatt came to the Heights after four seasons at Central Florida. During that time, the Knights compiled a 37-12 record, including an undefeated regular season in 2018, and four bowl game appearances, including the 2019 Fiesta Bowl. In 2021, Wyatt and the Knights produced two 500-yard receivers in Ryan O'Keefe (812) and Brandon Johnson (565). O'Keefe set a UCF single-season record with 84 receptions.

Previously, he was at Houston in 2016 as the wide receivers coach and recruiting coordinator. Wyatt was on staff at Texas from 2011-13 under Mack Brown. He was co-offensive coordinator and wide receivers coach in 2013, while serving as co-recruiting coordinator and wide receivers coach in 2011 and 2012.

Phil Matusz (mah-TOOSZ) begins his fourth year as the head strength and conditioning coach for the Boston College football program. In his time with the Eagles, he has overseen the physical and weight training development of four NFL Draft picks, including first-round selections Zion Johnson (2022-Chargers) and Zay Flowers (2023-Ravens).

Prior to his arrival at the Heights, Matusz spent six seasons with the Ohio State football program after initially joining the program's strength and conditioning staff as an assistant coach in February 2014. He was promoted to associate director, strength and conditioning, in 2017. The Buckeyes also played for four Big Ten championships and won three straight from 2017-19 during his tenure.

Matusz helped the Buckeye football program win the inaugural College Football Playoff national championship in 2014 and four Big Ten Conference championships, including three straight from 2017-19.

He came to Ohio State from the Main Line in Philadelphia where he had worked two seasons as the head football strength and conditioning coach at Villanova, his alma mater.

Matusz had two stints at Villanova; the first coming after the National Championship season in August 2010 when he was an intern in the strength and conditioning program, and the second beginning in 2011 after he returned to be the Head Olympic Strength and Conditioning Coach. He was quickly promoted just a year later to work with the football program. In between his time at Villanova, Matusz was an Assistant Strength and Conditioning Coach at North Carolina A&T.

A native of Greenville, Pa., Matusz's programs at Villanova covered all aspects of performance, including strength training, speed, agility, conditioning, flexibility, mobility, soft tissue work and nutrition. In addition to working with the football program, he also designed programs for men's and women's lacrosse, baseball, softball, volleyball and women's soccer.

A standout on the football field, Matusz was a three-year starter on the defensive line for the Wildcats and the team captain of Villanova's 2009 FCS National Championship team. For his efforts in 2009, Matusz was a CSN honorable mention All-American and a second-team All-CAA honoree. In his five years with the program, Villanova posted a 41-19 record, including a 24-4 mark in his final two seasons.

Matusz is Strength and Conditioning Coach Certified (SCCC) through Collegiate Strength, Conditioning Coaches Association and Certified Strength and Conditioning Specialist (CSCS) through the National Strength and Conditioning Association. He also is a Performance Enhancement Specialist (PES) through the National Academy of Sports Medicine. He also holds multiple certifications from Functional Anatomy Seminars; Certified Functional Range Assessment Specialist (FRA), Certified FRC Mobility Specialist (FRCms) and Certified Functional Range Strength Coach (FRSC). He has graduated with Master's Degrees in Performance Enhancement and Injury Prevention from PennWest California and Sport Administration from Boston College in the Woods College of Advancing Studies. Also completing a Certificate program in Child & Family Mental Health and Wellness from Boston College in the Lynch School of Education and Human Development.

The 2023 season will be the 125th year of intercollegiate football competition for the Boston College Eagles. Here are a few of the milestones that have been reached along the way:

1891 — The Boston College student body was granted permission, but no money, by President Edward I. Devitt, S.J., to organize a football team. Joseph F. O'Donnell (1892), a Dorchester, Massachusetts, native with some previous amateur football experience, helped organize a team that played an informal schedule the following year.

1893 — Boston College began formal football competition. The team's first game was a 4-0 victory over St. John's Institute, an amateur power of the day (touchdowns were scored as four points by existing rules). BC played its first intercollegiate game on Oct. 25, a 6-0 loss to Tech '97, an MIT class team. The first varsity game was a 10-6 victory over Boston University in the final contest of the year. Joseph C. Drum ('94) served as BC's first football coach and the team's captain was Bernie Wefers ('94), who briefly held the world record in the 200-meter dash and 220-yard dash.

1894 — The Boston College football team got its first compensated coach, William Nagle. The school adopted the team colors of maroon and gold.

1896 — Boston College and Jesuit rival Holy Cross met for the first time in a home-and-home series. Boston College won both games, by scores of 6-2 and 8-6.

1900 — College President W.G. Read Mullan, S.J., refused to allow a football team to play under the school's name. Students formed an independent team named "Boston Combination" that competed locally. Fr. Mullan relented and allowed a varsity team to be fielded the following year.

1903-07 — In a reaction to the growing public outcry against the violence of college football, as well as for economic considerations, the sport was dropped at Boston College. United States President Theodore Roosevelt summoned the leaders of college football to Washington and urged that the rules of the sport be tightened. The resulting rules committee evolved into the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA).

1908 — Varsity football was restored. The team practiced on the Massachusetts Avenue Grounds, site of a former city dump. Team members mowed the grass and lined the field before practice.

1913 — The college moved from its original location on James Street in Boston's South End to a new campus in Chestnut Hill. The football team's locker room and equipment storage area were located in the basement of the "Recitation Building" (renamed Gasson Hall in 1952), but coach Hiker Joy's team walked to the public park in Cleveland Circle for daily practice.

1915 — The original Alumni Stadium was dedicated on Oct. 30; however, the inaugural game was won by arch-rival Holy Cross by a 9-0 score before some 5,000 fans. A week later, Boston College won its first on-campus game, defeating Fordham, 3-0. The stadium was located on Middle Campus on the site of today's Stokes Hall.

1918 — Because of required military training for students in preparation for World War I, the football team was forced to limit practice sessions to no more than one hour per day.

1919 — A returning war hero, Frank Cavanaugh, was hired as BC's football coach. Known as "The Iron Major," Cavanaugh had been badly wounded in the Battle of San Mihiel, but recovered to launch a coaching career that would eventually lead him into the College Football Hall of Fame. In his first season at BC, he led his team to a startling 5-3 victory over heavily favored Yale — the biggest win in school history to that point. A 1943 movie, "The Iron Major" starring Pat O'Brien, chronicled Cavanaugh's life story. Part of the film was shot at the former Liggett Estate (now O'Connell House) on BC's Upper Campus.

1920 — The Boston College football team adopted the nickname "Eagles." The season was capped by a stirring 14-0 victory over Holy Cross before 40,000 fans at Braves Field. The win gave the team a perfect 8-0 season and the school's first "Eastern Championship."

1921 — The team's budding success drew national interest. The Eagles were invited to play Baylor in the dedication game of Dallas' Cotton Bowl stadium. The BC team, which made the 2,400-mile trip by train to play its first inter-sectional contest, responded with a 23-7 win over the Bears.

1926 — The final year of the Cavanaugh era produced another unbeaten season (6-0-2). The team captain was Joe McKenney, who would return to coach the Eagles from 1928-34.

1928 — McKenney's first year as head coach was a perfect 9-0 season and yielded another Eastern title. McKenney would later gain entrance into the College Football Hall of Fame as a highly respected college football official.

1936 — BC named Gilmour Dobie, another future College Hall of Fame member, as its head football coach. The Eagles' schedule was upgraded to include such national rivals as Kansas State, Kentucky, North Carolina State, Indiana and Florida, and home games were shifted to Fenway Park and Braves Field. Dobie's teams lost only six games in his three-year tenure.

1939 — On Feb. 7, Frank Leahy was named head football coach. "I have come here to succeed and to win football games," he told alumni a few days later. He did both, as the Boston College football team won 20 of 22 games played in the ensuing two seasons. The Eagles lost only one regular-season game in the 1939 campaign (7-0 to Florida) and became the first New England team in 20 years to earn a New Year's Day bowl invitation. The Eagles met Clemson in the Cotton Bowl on Jan. 1, but lost a close 6-3 decision to the Tigers.

1940 — An undefeated (11-0) season, capped by the Sugar Bowl championship and the claim of a national championship made this arguably the greatest season in Eagle football annals. On Nov. 16, BC handed Georgetown its first football loss in three years when "Chuckin" Charlie O'Rourke eluded a host of tacklers and took a safety in his own end zone as the clock expired to give the Eagles a memorable 19-18 victory. Sportswriter Grantland Rice described the contest as "the greatest game of football ever played."

1941 — On Jan. 1, the Eagles would lay claim to the national championship with a 19-13 victory over Tennessee in the Sugar Bowl. Again, O'Rourke provided the heroics, scoring on a 24-yard touchdown run with three minutes remaining in the game. Leahy had installed the game-winning play in the BC offense one day before the game. Leahy and five members of the Sugar Bowl championship team would eventually be enshrined in the College Football Hall of Fame (HB O'Rourke, C Chet Gladchuk, E Gene Goodreault, FB Mike Holovak and G George Kerr). A crowd of 100,000 people welcomed the Sugar Bowl victors back to Boston's South Station, but Leahy would leave Boston College for Notre Dame within a month of the game.

1941 — From a field of 80 candidates, Denny Myers was named Boston College's new head coach.

1942 — The Eagles were undefeated and ranked No. 1 in the land as they headed into the final game of the season against Holy Cross on Nov. 28. The Crusaders pulled off one of the biggest upsets in college football history that day, upending BC by a 55-12 score. Many BC players and fans were so bitterly disappointed that a planned "victory party" at Boston's Coconut Grove restaurant was canceled. The Coconut Grove was destroyed by fire that night, and 492 people lost their lives.

1943 — Again playing on New Year's Day, Boston College lost to Alabama in the Orange Bowl, 37-21. One bright point in the game for the Eagles was the play of Holovak, who scored all three BC touchdowns and averaged 15.8 yards every time he touched the football — an Orange Bowl record that stands to this day.

1943-45 — A large number of Boston College players and coaches departed to serve their country in the United States armed forces during World War II. The teams fielded on campus found competition against service teams such as Melville PT and Squantum Naval Air Station.

1946 — Myers returned as head coach after the war and the Eagles undertook a national schedule that included LSU, Tennessee, Mississippi, Oklahoma, Michigan State and Penn State in following years. Two members of that September's freshman class — linemen Art Donovan and Ernie Stautner — would one day be elected to the Pro Football Hall of Fame. The roster also included lineman Ed King, who, after a brief pro football career, would later be elected Governor of Massachusetts.

1949 — On Nov. 26, BC scored its most lopsided victory, 76-0, over annual rival Holy Cross. BC fullback/kicker Ed Petela scored a record 34 points in the game — four touchdowns and 10 PATs.

1951 — Mike Holovak, who had played professional football with the Los Angeles Rams and Chicago Bears, returned to his alma mater as head coach. He later would be the head coach of the Boston Patriots and long-time general manager of the Houston Oilers.

1956 — After losing to Holy Cross, 7-0, on Dec. 1, Boston College was told that football games will no longer be played at Fenway Park. The school considered dropping the sport.

1957 — On Jan. 23, Boston College President Joseph R. N. Maxwell, S.J., announced the decision to build a new stadium on campus. Athletics Director William J. Flynn and former head coach Joe McKenney led the successful \$250,000 campaign to construct the new facility on the site of a filled-in reservoir on BC's lower campus. On Sept. 26, Alumni Stadium opened with a game against Navy that had been arranged with the assistance of then-U.S. Senator John F. Kennedy. The visiting Midshipmen spoiled the day, however, with a 46-6 victory before a standing-room-only crowd of 26,000-plus. The referee in the dedication game was the legendary Albie Booth.

1964 — The Eagles knocked off highly ranked Syracuse, 21-14, on Sept. 19 in the season opener as Larry Marzetti hit Bill Cronin with a 45-yard touchdown pass on a fourth-down play as time ran out. A freshman running back for the Orangemen that year was Tom Coughlin.

1968 — Joe Yukica took over as the Eagles' head coach. He served notice of things to come with a stunning 49-15 win at Navy in his BC coaching debut. Among the defenders for the Midshipmen in that game was end Tom O'Brien.

1970 — Fred Willis became the first running back in BC gridiron history to surpass 1,000 yards rushing (1,007) in a 10-game season.

1971 — Alumni Stadium was expanded to 32,000 seats, an artificial surface was installed and lights were added for night play.

1974 — The Eagles, under Yukica and offensive backfield coach Jack Bicknell, were the hottest team in college football down the stretch, outscoring opponents by a 270-27 margin in the season's final six games. FB Keith Barnette was the nation's top scorer with 22 TDs on the season. However, the team's 8-3 record did not attract any bowl invitations to Chestnut Hill.

1975 — The Eagles opened the season with an ABC-TV "Monday Night Football" appearance against Notre Dame at Schaefer Stadium in Foxboro. A record 61,000 fans filled the facility to watch the Irish take a 17-3 victory.

1976 — BC upended seventh-ranked Texas, 14-13, in a thrilling season opener at Alumni Stadium on Sept. 11. A key tackle by Kelly Elias on a Longhorn two-point conversion try with 4:38 remaining in the game proved the difference in this victory, the biggest for a BC team in years.

1978 — The Eagles suffered their worst season in history, losing all 11 games, including a 28-24 loss to Temple in a game played in Tokyo on Dec. 10.

1981 — Former BC assistant Bicknell was hired as head coach. He opened the season with a 13-12 home victory over Texas A&M on Sept. 19. Freshman Doug Flutie saw his first action — on one special teams play. Flutie would be named the team's starting quarterback by Bicknell and QB coach Tom Coughlin prior to the Navy game on Oct. 17.

1982 — The Eagles opened the season with a smashing 38-16 victory over Texas A&M in College Station. Two weeks later, BC tied defending national champion Clemson 17-17 at "Death Valley," and once again Boston College football was drawing national attention. After beating Holy Cross 35-10 in the final regular season game, the Eagles were invited to the 1982 Tangerine Bowl in Orlando to play Auburn. Fans watching that game saw two future Heisman Trophy winners: BC's Flutie and the Tigers' Bo Jackson. Auburn won the Dec. 18 game, 33-26.

1983 — The Eagles finished the regular season with a 9-2 record, including the first win over Penn State (27-17 at Foxboro) and a last-minute 20-13 victory over Alabama on a rainy November night in Foxboro that was remembered as the game "that the lights went out." Fortunately, power crews restored electricity just as officials were considering stopping the game and BC went on to score on its final possession to win. The Lambert Trophy champions were matched up against Notre Dame in the Liberty Bowl on Dec. 29 — a game that was played in frigid, icy conditions. Each team scored three touchdowns in that game, but BC missed all of its extra-point tries, while the Irish converted one of three to account for the heart-breaking 19-18 final score.

1984 — Perhaps one of the most storied seasons in Boston College football history, an early highlight was the Eagles' stunning 38-31 victory over Alabama in Birmingham before a national television audience on Sept. 8. The Eagles scored on their final possession of the game to beat the Crimson Tide — an omen of rallies to come. On Nov. 22, at the Orange Bowl, Flutie and Boston College football went into the storybooks as No. 22 threw a 48-yard "Hail Mary" touchdown pass to WR Gerard Phelan on the game's final play to give BC a memorable 47-45 victory over the Miami Hurricanes. A week later, Flutie completed one of his final college football goals by throwing a touchdown pass to his brother Darren, a freshman, in the final game of the regular season at Holy Cross on Dec. 1. He then flew to New York City where he was presented with the Heisman Trophy later that night.

1985 — Boston College scored its first postseason victory since the 1941 Sugar Bowl with an impressive 45-28 victory over Houston in the Cotton Bowl on New Year's Day. The Eagles were ranked No. 4 in the final college football poll and won the Lambert Trophy as Eastern Champions for the second consecutive year.

1985 — Appearing in the Kickoff Classic, the Eagles lost to high-powered Brigham Young, 28-14, in the college football curtain-raiser, but NG Mike Ruth chased Cougar QBs all over the field en route to eventually winning the Outland Award as college football's top lineman that season.

1986 — After thrashing Holy Cross by a 56-26 score in Worcester on Nov. 22, the Eagles were invited to play Georgia in Tampa's Hall of Fame Bowl on Dec. 23. There, QB Shawn Halloran hit WR Kelvin Martin with a 5-yard scoring pass with just 32 seconds left in the game to give BC a 27-24 victory. Two months later, Holy Cross abruptly canceled the BC-HC rivalry that had begun in 1896.

1988 — A rebuilt Alumni Stadium with matching upper decks and state-of-the-art press facilities was dedicated in a nationally televised game against Southern Cal. On Nov. 19, Boston College and Army made sports history by playing the first American college football game in Europe. The Eagles topped the Cadets 38-24 in that contest, played at Dublin's Lansdowne Road Stadium.

1991 — Coughlin was hired away from the Super Bowl Champion New York Giants as BC's newest head football coach. BC played the first BIG EAST Football Conference game at Rutgers on August 31, the coach's 45th birthday.

1992 — BC scored three consecutive shutout victories (vs. Northwestern, Navy and Michigan State) on the way to an 8-2-1 regular season and a berth in the Hall of Fame Bowl against Tennessee. The Vols won the Sugar Bowl "rematch" by a 38-23 score.

1993 — The Eagles bounced back from losses in the first two games to reel off eight consecutive wins and earn another postseason invitation. Highlighting this drive was a magnificent 41-39 victory at Notre Dame on Nov. 20, when David Gordon kicked a 41-yard field goal with no time remaining to shock the No. 1-ranked Irish. The Eagles' final 8-3 showing earned them a slot in the Carquest Bowl in Fort Lauderdale, where they beat ACC representative Virginia, 31-13, on New Year's Day.

1994 — Alumni Stadium was expanded to its current capacity of 44,500 and was completely refurbished. Unfortunately, as had happened on three previous occasions, the Eagles lost the dedication game, this time, 12-7, to Virginia Tech on Sept. 17. BC made up for the loss, however, by scoring an impressive 30-11 victory over Notre Dame in Chestnut Hill on Oct. 8 — the Eagles' first win in their new lair. BC went on to cap the season with a Christmas Day appearance in the Aloha Bowl in Honolulu where the Eagle defense led the way to a 12-7 victory over Kansas State.

1995 — Boston College was again invited to participate in the Kickoff Classic at the Meadowlands, but fared no better than in their 1985 appearance and lost to Ohio State by a 38-6 count. All 12 of the Eagles' games were on network television that year.

1996 — Tom O'Brien was named head coach at Boston College on Dec. 13.

1997 — O'Brien recorded his first victory as a head coach on Sept. 13, as BC beat West Virginia, 31-24. It was the first time the Eagles had defeated the Mountaineers in Chestnut Hill since 1976.

1998 — Mike Cloud rushed for a BIG EAST and then-BC single-season record 1,726 yards to become Boston College's all-time leading rusher with 3,597 yards. He became a consensus first-team All-America selection and a finalist for the Doak Walker National Running Back of the Year Award. The Kansas City Chiefs selected him in the second round of the NFL Draft.

1999 — Boston College engineered the third-best turnaround in major college football by finishing the regular season with an 8-3 record and ranked 22nd nationally. BC received an invitation to play in the Insight.com Bowl, its first postseason appearance since 1994.

2000 — Boston College made its second straight trip to a bowl game as the Eagles defeated Arizona State by a 31-17 score in the Aloha Bowl. William Green became the third-straight Eagle back to rush for 1,000 yards or more in a season and offensive tackle Paul Zukauskas earned first-team All-America honors and was later picked in the seventh round of the NFL Draft by the Cleveland Browns.

2001 — The Eagles posted an 8-4 record and earned back-to-back bowl game wins with an impressive 20-16 win over Georgia in the Music City Bowl. Green rushed for 1,559 yards and earned first-team All-America honors. Green (16th, Cleveland) and OT Marc Colombo (29th, Chicago) were selected in the first round of the NFL Draft.

2002 — BC's 51-25 win over Toledo in the Motor City Bowl, an unprecedented third consecutive bowl victory, sent the 2002 senior class out with 32 victories in four years (32-17), tied with the 1981-84 group for the most wins in a four-year period in 60 years of Boston College football. One of the top highlights of the season occurred on Nov. 2, when the Eagles marched into Notre Dame Stadium and defeated the previously undefeated, fourth-ranked and green-clad Fighting Irish, 14-7, to end ND's dreams of a national championship.

2003 — On Oct. 12, 2003, BC President William P. Leahy, S.J. and Director of Athletics Gene DeFilippo held a press conference to announce that Boston College accepted an offer to become the 12th member of the Atlantic Coast Conference. The Eagles notched impressive victories over Notre Dame, No. 25 Penn State and No. 12 Virginia Tech en route to winning their 40th game in five seasons, tying an all-time school record. On New Year's Eve, the Eagles appeared in a school-record fifth consecutive bowl game at the Diamond Walnut San Francisco Bowl. Their 35-21 victory over Colorado State made the Eagles the first team in BC football history to win seven or more games for five consecutive seasons and the only team in college football to have won a bowl game the past four years in a row. Senior running back Derrick Knight became BC's all-time rushing leader, finishing his career with 3,725 yards.

2004 — The Eagles rolled to a 9-3 season, winning a share of the BIG EAST Conference championship and missing a Fiesta Bowl bid only by a loss to Syracuse on the final day of the campaign. Senior QB Paul Peterson engineered a thrilling 24-23 victory at Notre Dame with a last-minute 30-yard touchdown pass to Tony Gonzalez setting up the victory. Peterson was injured two weeks later in a win against Temple, but the Utah native returned to the lineup to lead the Eagles to a 37-24 victory over future ACC rival North Carolina in the Continental Tire Bowl in Charlotte.

2005 — After season-opening victories at Brigham Young and Army, Boston College played its first ACC game — a nationally-televised contest against Florida State on Sept. 21. ESPN's "Game Day" crew was on hand to broadcast from campus prior to the much-anticipated ACC match-up. The Eagles lost to Bobby Bowden's powerful Seminoles 28-17 in their league debut, but introduced themselves as a force to be reckoned with in the ACC with a 16-13 overtime victory at Clemson a week later. BC finished with another impressive 9-3 record and went on to play Boise State in the Humanitarian Bowl where they handed the host Broncos a rare defeat, 27-21, on their home blue turf.

2006 — Another successful year for BC football, as the team finished with a 10-3 record, including a pair of double-overtime victories over Clemson (34-33) and Brigham Young (30-23) on back-to-back September Saturdays. The big news of the year, however, came in December as Coach Tom O'Brien left Chestnut Hill to become head coach at ACC rival North Carolina State. Defensive coordinator Frank Spaziani took over leadership of the team for the Meineke Care Bowl against Navy in Charlotte and recorded his first head coaching victory as linebacker Jolann Dunbar recovered a Midshipman fumble late in the game and QB Matt Ryan led the Eagles back into scoring range where kicker Steve Aponavicius booted a 37-yard field goal to give BC a narrow 25-24 victory.

2007 — With new coach Jeff Jagodzinski — a former BC offensive line coach and NFL assistant — at the helm, the new-look Eagles rolled off eight straight victories to start the year — the best of them a stunning 14-10 win at Virginia Tech that featured two Matt Ryan touchdown passes in the game's final 2:11 — the game-winner a 24-yard scoring strike to RB Andre Callender with just seconds to play. The victory propelled BC to the No. 2 slot in the national rankings and helped them finish the regular season with a 10-2 mark, earning a spot in the ACC Championship game in Jacksonville vs. Virginia Tech. The Eagles lost to the Hokies, 30-16, in the title game, but bounced back to trim Michigan State, 24-21, in Orlando's Citrus Bowl, giving the team an 11-victory season, the most wins at Chestnut Hill since the legendary Sugar Bowl Champions of 1940.

2008 — As All-America QB Matt Ryan departed for the NFL (he was the first round draft choice of the Atlanta Falcons), the Eagles regrouped quickly to post another 9-3 regular season that included a 17-0 shutout of Notre Dame — the Eagles' sixth consecutive win over the Irish. BC again won the ACC Atlantic Division crown and advanced to the league's title game again where Virginia Tech won a second straight championship at BC's expense. After losing to Vanderbilt, 16-14, in Nashville's Music City Bowl, Jagodzinski looked into NFL job possibilities and departed Chestnut Hill.

2009 — A longtime BC defensive assistant, Frank Spaziani became the school's 34th head football coach, inheriting a team that was picked to finish last in the ACC's Atlantic Division. He led the team to an 8-5 record, earning a spot in San Francisco's Emerald Bowl against Southern California.

2010 — The defensively powerful Eagles qualified for a school-record 12th consecutive postseason bowl game, returning to San Francisco to meet Nevada in the re-named Kraft Fight Hunger Bowl.

2011 — For the first time in more than a decade, the Eagles slipped below .500 and missed out on postseason play. The season spotlight belonged to two-time All-American LB Luke Kuechly who made a "clean sweep" of national defensive honors, including ACC Defensive Player of the Year, the Bronko Nagurski Trophy, the Butkus Award, the Rotary Lombardi Award and the Lott Impact Trophy after leading all collegiate football players in tackles (191) and solo tackles (102) during the 2011 campaign. Kuechly entered the NFL Draft after his junior season and was selected by the Carolina Panthers in the first round.

2012 — The Eagles slipped to a disappointing 2-10 season, the worst showing since the winless (0-11) season in 1978. At the end of the year, coach Frank Spaziani was replaced by former Temple head coach Steve Addazio, who was named BC's 35th head coach of football on Dec. 4.

2013 — The Addazio era began with a 24-14 victory over feisty Villanova in his BC coaching debut. The Eagles turned in a successful seven-win season and an invitation to play Pac-12 opponent Arizona in the Advocare v100 Bowl game in Shreveport, Louisiana on Dec. 31 — the Eagles' first post-season appearance since 2010. Along the way, BC scored ACC victories over Wake Forest, Virginia Tech, Maryland and North Carolina State. The 38-21 victory over the Wolfpack on Nov. 16, made the Eagles bowl-eligible and set off an enthusiastic celebration in Alumni Stadium, hailing the program's return to the ranks of college football's upper echelon. Running back Andre Williams rushed for a school-record 2,177 yards and 18 touchdowns. Williams was accorded consensus All-America honors; won the Doak Walker Award as the nation's top running back; and became BC's first Heisman Trophy finalist since the Doug Flutie nearly 30 years earlier.

2014 — Addazio kept the Eagles on track with another winning season and another postseason bowl trip. BC went 7-6, highlighted by an electric, 37-31 upset over ninth-ranked Southern California in Alumni Stadium on Sept. 13. The Eagles topped the Trojans for the first BC victory versus a top-10 team in seven years and the first win for an unranked BC team against a top-10 team since 2002. BC became

bowl eligible on Nov. 1 with a three-point victory at Virginia Tech and later earned a berth to the New Era Pinstripe Bowl in Yankee Stadium against Penn State on Dec. 27. The defense ranked second in the nation, allowing just 94.5 yards per game and the offense finished the season 14th with 254.7 yards per game, setting a BC school record with 3,311 total yards. Quarterback Tyler Murphy made a lasting impression in his one season at The Heights, setting both the Boston College and Atlantic Coast Conference records for rushing yards by a QB with 1,184.

2015 — Although the team went 3-9 to miss out on a bowl game for the first time in three seasons, it was led by the nation's best defense. The Eagles held defending national champion Florida State to only one offensive touchdown and kept the Eagles within a touchdown of winning five games. The Eagles ranked first in total defense and first downs defense and fourth in scoring defense.

2016 — The Eagles won seven games (7-6) and returned to a bowl game for the third time in four seasons. Boston College won its first bowl game since 2007 after a 36-30 victory over Maryland in the Quick Lane Bowl. The Eagles finished the season with three consecutive victories and featured the nation's ninth-best defense. Junior Harold Landry earned All-America honors from the Associated Press and Walter Camp Football Foundation as he led the nation in sacks (16.5) and forced fumbles (seven).

2017 — The Eagles won seven games (7-6) and returned to a bowl game for the fourth time in five seasons. Boston College was just one of two bowl teams nationally to play 10 teams who qualified for a bowl in 2017. The Eagles featured ACC Rookie of the Year AJ Dillon, the nation's second-leading rusher among freshmen and the country's No. 7 overall rusher with 1,589 yards and 14 touchdowns. Boston College had nine players earn All-ACC honors, tied for the most in school history. Three Eagles earned All-America accolades (Lukas Denis, Walter Camp Second Team; AJ Dillon, Freshman All-America; Ben Petrula, Freshman All-America).

2018 — The Eagles won seven games (7-5) and returned to a bowl game for the fifth time in six seasons. The Eagles made their first appearance in the College Football Playoff Top 25 rankings, returned to the national AP and coaches' polls for the first time since 2008 and hosted College GameDay for the third time in school history. BC started the season 7-2 overall and spent four weeks in the national rankings, the most weeks ranked since the 2007 campaign. Four players captured All-America honors (Hamp Cheevers, Chris Lindstrom, Michael Walker and Zach Allen) while BC tied a modern-day record with four players selected in the 2019 NFL Draft (Chris Lindstrom, Zach Allen, Will Harris, Tommy Sweeney). Lindstrom became the 20th first-round pick in school history going 14th overall to the Atlanta Falcons.

2019 — Boston College finished the regular season 6-6 overall and AD Martin Jarmond announced a change in leadership following the win over Pitt in the regular season finale. Jarmond appointed Ohio State defensive coordinator Jeff Hafley as the program's 36th head coach in history on Dec. 14, 2019.

AJ Dillon and John Phillips earned All-ACC first-team honors following the season while Dillon finished fourth in ACC history in career rushing yards. He was a second-round pick of the Green Bay Packers in the 2020 NFL Draft and an AP All-American third-team selection.

2020 — In his first season on the Heights, Hafley finished with the most victories of any first-year head coach in college football in 2020 with a 6-5 record.

More impressive than the marked improvement on both sides of the ball from Boston College in 2020 was how the program handled playing in the COVID-19 pandemic. BC's team had just one positive COVID-19 result in over 9,000 administered tests since the team returned to campus last June.

Hafley, one of college football's top defensive minds, helped improve a BC defense 52 spots in the national rankings in total defense as the Eagles allowed 62 fewer yards per game than the previous year prior to his arrival.

Nine Eagles were named All-ACC in 2020, including the first wide receiver to be named All-ACC First-Team in Zay Flowers since 2012. Tight end Hunter Long was named a Second Team All-American by multiple outlets as he led all tight ends nationally in receptions and finished the year second in receptions.

2021 — Boston College started year-two under Hafley a perfect 4-0 in non-conference play, capped by an overtime win over Missouri from the Southeastern Conference at Alumni Stadium. The Eagles finished the year 6-6 and earned a bid to the Military Bowl in Annapolis, Md., which was ultimately cancelled.

A total of 12 Eagles earned All-ACC accolades, including first-team offensive linemen Zion Johnson and Alec Lindstrom. Both earned All-American status, while Johnson and was selected 17th overall in the first round of the 2022 NFL Draft by the Los Angeles Chargers.

Pat Garwo, an All-ACC second team selection, became the 19th 1,000-yard rusher in BC history with 1,045 yards, which ranked fourth in the ACC.

2022 — Zay Flowers rewrote the BC record book for receivers as the program's all-time leader in receptions, touchdowns and yards. He captured single-season marks in touchdowns and receptions on his way to earning All-America and being the first BC wide receiver to be selected in the first round of the NFL Draft by the Baltimore Ravens. He finished the season with 12 receiving touchdowns and 1,077 yards on 78 receptions, which tied the program record. Flowers' career ended atop the record books at 200 receptions, 3,056 receiving yards and 29 receiving touchdowns.

RETIRED NUMBERS

Never again will a Boston College football player wear the No. 22 or No. 68. Those two retired numbers belonged to quarterback Doug Flutie (1981-84) and nose tackle Mike Ruth (1982-85), respectively. Flutie won the 1984 Heisman Trophy, given annually by the Downtown Athletic Club of New York to the outstanding college football player in the nation, and the Walter Camp Award, given by the Walter Camp Football Foundation of New Haven, Connecticut, to the nation's most outstanding player.

Ruth was the winner of the 1985 Outland Trophy, given to the outstanding interior lineman in the nation by the Football Writers Association of America.

These two numbers were retired in a ceremony on Oct. 8, 1998, as the Eagles played Virginia Tech.

RETIRED JERSEYS

Ten other former Boston College football players have received the honor of having their jerseys retired — Art Donovan, Bill Flynn, Gene Goodreault, Mike Holovak, Luke Kuechly, Pete Mitchell, Lou Montgomery, Charles O'Rourke, Matt Ryan, Tony Thurman and Louis Urban.

A four-year letterwinner at end and team captain in 1923, Urban played on Boston College teams that compiled an overall record of 25-7, including the 1920 team that went 8-0 and gave the school its first Eastern Championship. He was a consensus first-team all-America selection in that season.

O'Rourke's Boston College teams compiled a cumulative record of 26-3-2. "Chuckin' Charlie" helped lead the Eagles to an 11-0 record in 1940, capped by the Sugar Bowl championship and the claim of a national championship. He was inducted into the National Football Foundation and College Football Hall of Fame in 1972.

Holovak's Boston College teams finished 26-5 and he is known as one of the top running backs in school history. He scored all three Eagle touchdowns in the 1943 Orange Bowl and averaged 15.8 yards per carry in that contest against Alabama. A consensus first-team all-American in 1942, he was inducted into the College

Football Hall of Fame in 1985.

Thurman was a consensus first-team all-America pick in 1984 as a defensive back and still holds the school career records for interceptions in a game (3), season (12) and career (25).

Flynn, who was honored in ceremonies at 1999's Miami game, was associated with Boston College athletics for nearly seven decades as a student-athlete, faculty member, coach and director of athletics. He played football at Boston College from 1936-38, serving as team captain in '38. He also played hockey and became the first Boston College player to score 20 goals in a season.

Flynn returned to the University in 1945 as a mathematics teacher and assistant football coach and seven years later became the Alumni Association executive secretary. Flynn was the director of athletics for the Eagles from 1957-90, and during his tenure, Boston College expanded its varsity sports programs and constructed most of its major athletics facilities.

Donovan, who was honored at the 1999 Pittsburgh game, was a four-year letterman for the Eagles from 1946-49 and was an outstanding lineman for his teams that went a combined 20-13-3.

In the professional ranks, he played on two world championship teams in 12 seasons as a perennial all-pro selection at defensive tackle for the Baltimore Colts. He was inducted into the Professional Football Hall of Fame in 1968.

Goodreault, who was honored at 2001's Pittsburgh game at Alumni Stadium, was a member of the Boston College football team that won the 1941 Sugar Bowl.

He lettered for the Eagles from 1938-40 as an end and was a consensus first-team all-America pick in 1940, including a spot on the Walter Camp All-America team.

In the fall of 1937, Montgomery was one of three Black students in the BC freshman class and became the first Black student-athlete on the Heights as a running back for the football team. He starred out of the backfield for coach Frank Leahy's squad in 1939 and 1940, but was forced to sit out the 1940 Cotton Bowl and 1941 Sugar Bowl due to discriminating laws that prevented Black athletes from competing against white athletes in America's south.

In 1939, Montgomery averaged 9.68 yards per carry; a BC record that still stands over 80 years later. However, Montgomery played in just nine of 11 games for the Eagles, who finished the season 9-2. Montgomery was forced to sit out games against Florida and Clemson; BC's only two losses on the season.

Kuechly became the most decorated defensive player in BC football history after sweeping every major postseason award in 2012, including the Dick Butkus Award, the Lott IMPACT Trophy, the Bronko Nagurski Award and the Rotary Lombardi Award. The two-time consensus first-team All-American finished his three-year collegiate career led the nation for two consecutive seasons in total tackles, tackles per game, solo tackles and solo tackles per game. He finished his collegiate career with a school-record 532 tackles and ranks among the NCAA career leaders in several defensive statistical categories.

He recorded at least 10 tackles in 34 of 38 games, including a streak of 33 straight games between 2009-11. He was selected by the Carolina Panthers in the first round (ninth overall) in the 2012 NFL Draft and has continued to rack up honors as a professional. In his first season, he was named AP Defensive Rookie of the Year and one season later, he was selected for the Pro Bowl and AP overall Defensive Player of the Year. In Carolina's 2015 Super Bowl run, he became the first linebacker in the Super Bowl era with

multiple interception return touchdowns in a single postseason. Ryan, nicknamed "Matty Ice," capped an illustrious Boston College career by being selected third overall by the Atlanta Falcons in the NFL draft, becoming BC's highest draft pick ever in any sport. During his standout senior season in 2007, he led the team to an 8-0 start and No. 2 national ranking en route to an 11-3 record (best since 1940), the ACC Atlantic Division championship and the school's first-ever appearance in the ACC Championship game. He was the winner of the Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Award (given to the nation's top senior quarterback), the Manning Award (given to the nation's top quarterback), was ACC Player of the Year and finished seventh in Heisman Trophy balloting. He set the BC school record for single-season passing yards and when he completed 388-of-654 passes for 4,507 yards and 31 touchdowns in 2007. In eight seasons in the NFL, he has completed 2,915 of 4,530 passes (64.3 percent) for 32,757 yards and 202 touchdowns while posting a 90.9 passer rating. He owns franchise records for career passing yards, career pass attempts, career completions, career touchdowns, career passing rating, career completion percentage and career 300-yard games.

Mitchell was a two-time first-team All-American, earning consensus honors in 1994. He is one of only 12 Boston College players to earn consensus All-America honors in school history. A two-time All-BIG EAST first-team performer, Mitchell led the conference in receptions in each of his last two seasons. At the time he completed his career at BC, he was the school's all-time leader in receptions (190) and receiving yards (2,388).

Tight end Tommy Sweeney had a career-high seven receptions for 137 yards and true freshman running back AJ Dillon rushed for 157 yards for his seventh 100-yard game but Boston College (7-6) fell to the University of Iowa (8-5), 27-20, in the New Era Pinstripe Bowl at Yankee Stadium on Wednesday evening. Both Sweeney and Dillon scored the Eagles' touchdowns.

After the Hawkeyes took an early 3-0 lead, Dillon scored on a four-yard touchdown run in the first quarter to go up 7-3. Both teams battled back and forth for the remainder of the game. Graduate quarterback Darius Wade connected with Sweeney on a 39-yard TD pass and junior Colton Lichtenberg hit a 30-yard field goal to give BC a seven-point lead going into halftime.

Iowa tied the game at 17 midway through the third quarter and the two teams traded field goals in the fourth to knot it at 20 with just over eight minutes to play. The Hawkeyes scored on a one-yard run with three minutes left in the game after Wade was sacked and fumbled at midfield. Iowa put together two big plays of 27 yards and 17 yards.

**WILLIAM V. CAMPBELL DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS**

Blake James was named the William V. Campbell Director of Athletics at Boston College, effective July 1, 2022.

James is an experienced, nationally respected athletics administrator who established a student-athlete approach at Miami that focused on academic achievement, athletic success, and individual development. James served as the school's director of athletics from 2013-2021, leading the Hurricanes to multiple NCAA and ACC championships across numerous sports. In his role, he oversaw 18 varsity sports involving more than 400 student-athletes,

with a staff of more than 250 individuals and an annual budget of \$123 million.

At Miami, he set records for athletics fundraising and led the completion of major capital projects, including new indoor facilities for football, baseball, and golf, and facility enhancements for men and women's basketball. He negotiated and managed one of the largest collegiate sports apparel deals in the country, and significantly increased ticket sales for the school's football and basketball programs.

A proven leader within the NCAA and ACC, James served on the NCAA Board of Directors (2017-2019), NCAA Board of Governors (2017-2019), the NCAA Football Oversight Committee (2015-2017), and held leadership roles on the NCAA Student Athlete Experience Committee (2019-2021). He also served as chair of the NCAA Division I Council, the group responsible for the day-to-day decision making for all Division I athletics. Within the ACC, he served on the Football Committee, the NIL Committee, and the Finance and Audit Committee, and was named chair of the conference's athletics directors. He was selected as one of four recipients of the Under Armour Athletic Director of the Year award by the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics in 2016.

In announcing the appointment, University President William P. Leahy, S.J., praised James as an individual with the proven record of accomplishment to lead Boston College Athletics into the future.

"Blake brings extensive experience, understands the issues facing intercollegiate athletics today, and is committed to BC's mission," said Fr. Leahy. "I look forward to welcoming him to Boston College."

James said he is excited to become BC's next director of athletics and looks forward to beginning his role: "It is truly an honor to join the Boston College family as the William V. Campbell Director of Athletics," said James. "I am grateful to Fr. Leahy for the opportunity to lead the Eagles and for his confidence in me and in our shared vision for BC Athletics. We will strive for excellence in all of our pursuits in alignment with our Jesuit values. We will compete for championships with integrity, with incredible young men and women, and talented and compassionate coaches and staff supporting their journeys."

A graduate of Minnesota State University-Mankato with a degree in marketing, James earned a master's degree in sports administration from St. Thomas University. He began his athletic career at the University of Miami in tickets sales and development before moving to Providence College to work in athletic development. He later served as director of athletics at the University of Maine where he directed 19 Division I sports programs from 2005-2010, before returning to Miami as its interim athletics director and senior associate A.D. for Development and Ticket Operations. He was named Miami's Director of Athletics in 2013.

Student-athletes are made available for interviews as a part of Jeff Hafley's Monday news conference and Wednesdays following the conclusion of practice. All Wednesday meetings will occur over Zoom.

An attempt is made for telephone and Zoom interviews for media outside the Boston area if arranged in advance with the BC Communications office on Wednesdays.

MEDIA CREDENTIALS

Media credential requests must be submitted via www.sportssystem.com/bostoncollege. Credentials for Boston College home games are issued to working media only and should be requested as early as possible due to space limitations and demand. Media credentials which cannot be mailed will be left at Media Will Call (Media Entrance) at Gate D of Alumni Stadium.

1. The Athletics Communication Office will do its best to accommodate legitimate requests for game credentials. Criteria for media credentials vary, as they are dependent on the availability of media seating. Priority seating for any event is as follows: local beat media, opponent beat media, local media, opponent media, national media, state/regional media, professional scouts, recognized Internet media and unaffiliated media. Those members of the media who are credentialed are asked to comply with guidelines set forth by the Football Writers Association of America. There is no cheering allowed in the press box, where there is also a no smoking policy in accordance with University regulations. Violators in both instances will first receive a warning, and upon any repeat violation, will be asked to leave the press facilities.
2. When the press box is not expected to be at capacity, legitimate single-game credential requests will be granted. For those high-volume games, the criteria under No. 3 below are used in processing and approving credential requests.
3. Credentials for home and road football games for local media are dependent on its organization's coverage of the BC football and athletic program (all sports). To qualify for passes, the team must be covered on a regular basis, and media personnel need to make an effort to have a presence at press conferences and practices (when open). Newspapers must provide feature coverage; radio and television stations must occasionally cover practice and attend the weekly press conference (Tuesdays).

Media credentials are issued solely to the person identified on it. It may not be transferred or used by any other person. Acceptance of a media credential requires compliance with all Boston

College rules and regulations applicable to the media credential. Any breach or failure to comply with these terms, conditions, rules and/or regulations may result in the cancellation and withdrawal of the media credential, including but not limited to expulsion from the athletics event for which it was issued, and denial of a media credential for any and all future athletics events.

PARKING

Media parking is located in the Commonwealth Avenue parking garage. Use the St. Ignatius Gate on lower campus at Campanella Way to access the Comm. Ave. parking garage. You should request your parking at the same time you request your game credential. If time permits, both will be mailed to you. There is no day-of-game media parking list and therefore members of the media must have a media parking credential in advance of the game.

PRESS BOX SERVICES

Complete NCAA statistics, play-by-play, and quote sheets from both teams are all regular services on gameday will be sent electronically. Upon your arrival, you will receive a flip card. Game notes will only be available online via BCEagles.com. The press box has wireless Internet access. Login information will be provided on gamedays.

POST-GAME INTERVIEWS

Jeff Hafley and student-athletes, following the designated cooling off period, will be made available after each game to members of the media. Hafley's press conference will take place in the Barber Room of the Yawkey Center, which is located opposite the playing field from the press box.

With approximately five minutes remaining in the game, members of the media are welcome to be escorted from the press box to the field prior to arriving at the Yawkey Center following the conclusion of the game.

Requested student-athletes will be made available in the Barber Room following Hafley's press conference. The visiting team's press conference will be held in the Conte Forum Media Center. A member of the Boston College Athletic Communications office will escort the visiting media to the Conte Forum Media Center.
