Membership of the WFP Executive Board

Suggested Action by the Council

In accordance with FAO Conference Resolution 7/2011, the Council is required to elect six FAO Member Nations to the WFP Executive Board for a term of office of three years (1 January 2020 - 31 December 2022) to fill the following seats:

- 2 seats from List A
- 1 seat from List B
- 1 seat from List C
- 2 seats from List D

The attached nomination form should be completed by Member Nations wishing to stand for the above seats and submitted to the Secretary-General of the Conference and Council (Room A140) by **12.00 hours on Monday, 25 November 2019**.

1. For purposes of election to the Board, FAO Member Nations are divided into five separate lists (A, B, C, D and E)* as shown on the FAO Council Web page under "Additional Information": <http://www.fao.org/about/meetings/council/cl163/en/>
2. The Council is required to elect six members for a term of office expiring on 31 December 2022 to replace the ones whose term ends on 31 December 2019, i.e. Angola (A), Argentina (C), Canada (D), Congo (A), Germany (D) and Pakistan (B).
3. Outgoing members are eligible for re-election.
4. A nomination form is given in *Appendix A*.
